



Targets are aware of and take the necessary precautions to prevent the further spread of ASF



than 10 languages including Slovakian, Croatian, Portuguese, Bulgarian and Romanian



 - Strengthen the capacities of Veterinary Services in Communication & training on Behaviour Change
 - 144 individuals trained

Behaviour Change Initiatives

- Behaviour Change Expert consultation in April 2019
 - Hosted 10 experts with expertise from all OIE regions
 - Outlined challenges in animal health sector
 - Core content and methods for handbook developed
- Handbook for Veterinary Services is currently underdevelopment and expert review

Conducted a teleconference with journalists to foster information exchange


