#### A monitoring tool...

A continuous and systematic mechanism of observation and analysis of Members' practices in implementing OIE standards



# ...to support improved implementation

- 1. To assist Members in implementation by tailoring capacity building activities on identified needs and by sharing practices (peer learning)
- 2. To enhance the OIE standard settingprocess through evidence-based assessment of the use of OIE standards

#### **Objective 1**

Identify Member's capacity assistance needs and identify successful practices

### **Objective 2**

Strengthen the quality and relevance of OIE standards



## **Key outputs of the OIE Observatory**

1

#### Implementation review report

High-level summary on the situation of the implementation of OIE standards; identification of the major implementation challenges and effective practices.

2

#### Thematic analysis

More comprehensive and focused analysis on priority topics, to better understand implementation challenges and to evaluate the quality and relevance of OIE standards.

3

#### **Country portal**

Available on the OIE website, providing information by country for existing public data on the implementation of OIE standards.



## **Scope & Pilot phase**

- Scope: Terrestrial & Aquatic Codes + Manuals
- Pilot Phase: Focus on OIE standards that already benefit from quality data coverage

Standards addressing **key cross-cutting issues**:

- Notification
- Surveillance
- Zoning and Compartmentalisation
- ► Applied to selected terrestrial animal diseases





# Aquatic animal production is important

- Growing importance for human nutrition and economies
  - Highest per capita consumption in history (and growing)
  - Greater than 1/3 production volumes traded internationally
- > Aquaculture production continues to grow
  - At current growth rates aquaculture production will double by 2030

## BUT...

Disease continues to be a major threat to aquaculture production

Efforts to manage aquatic animal health have not kept pace with growing risk

# **Drivers of an Aquatic Animal Health Strategy**

- ➤ There is <u>shared</u> and growing importance in aquatic animal production
- There is a shared and continuing threat of aquatic animal diseases
- There is a <u>shared</u> need to develop and implement collaborative actions to improve aquatic animal health and welfare.

# How an OIE Aquatic Animal Health Strategy can address these issues

- Identify the highest priority <u>common</u> needs
- Coordinate actions to the priority <u>common</u> needs
- Identify <u>actions</u> that provide enduring impacts
- Provide for <u>better utilisation</u> of existing resources, networks, systems
- Allow for a focus on areas of importance to aquatic animal health while supporting the 7<sup>th</sup> Strategic Plan
- Identify attractive opportunities for donor investment.

The ultimate goal is to improve aquatic animal health worldwide
