



### Human rabies cases




### Number of reported echinococcosis cases





## Surveillance Atlas of Infectious Diseases





- **Supporting Member States to strengthen the IHR (2005) core capacities for zoonotic disease, food safety and antimicrobial resistance using the One Health approach;**
- **Organizing joint policy meetings;**
- **Developing national action plans and roadmaps as well as national guidance and regulations on prevention and control of zoonotic diseases;**
- **Promoting multisectoral responses to food safety hazards, risks from zoonoses and other public health threats in the human-animal-environment interface;**
- **Improving surveillance of zoonotic diseases;**
- **Strengthening country capacities on diagnosis, surveillance and management of zoonotic diseases.**
