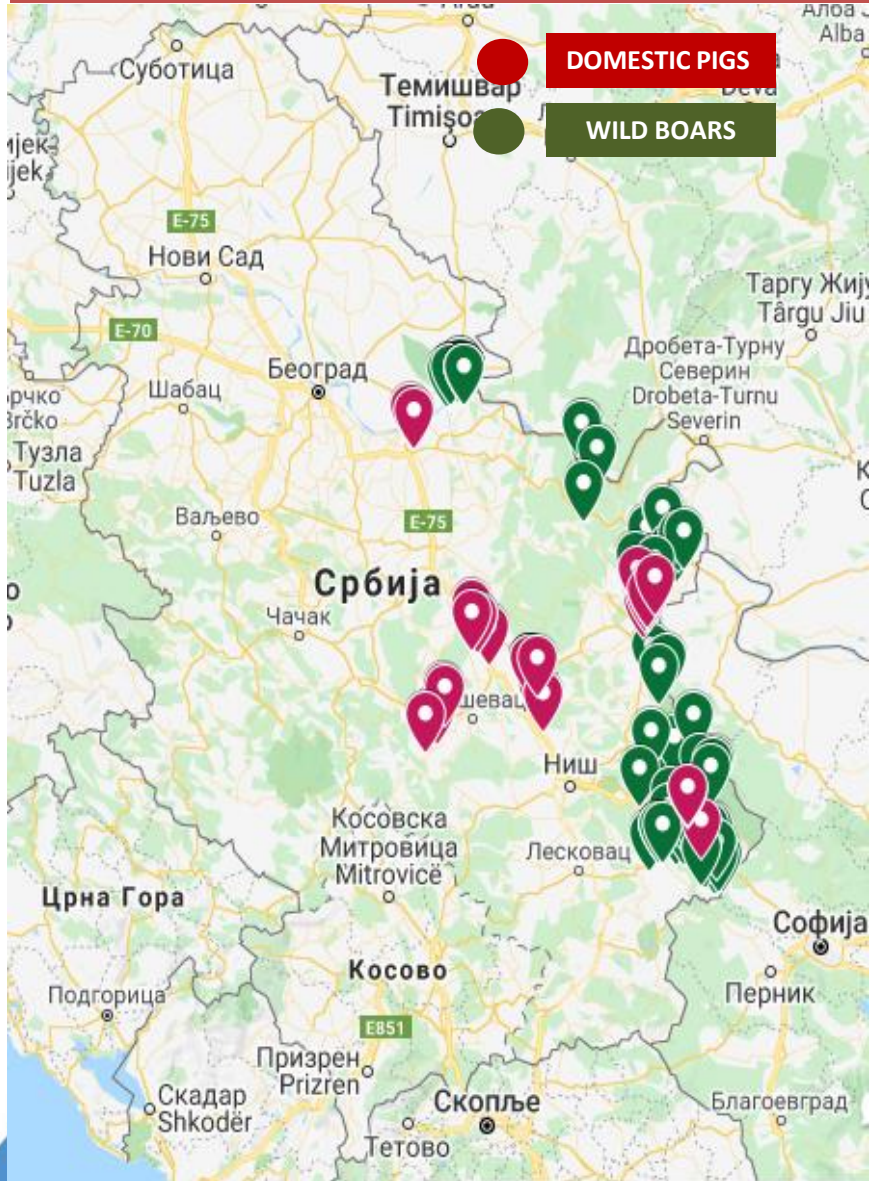

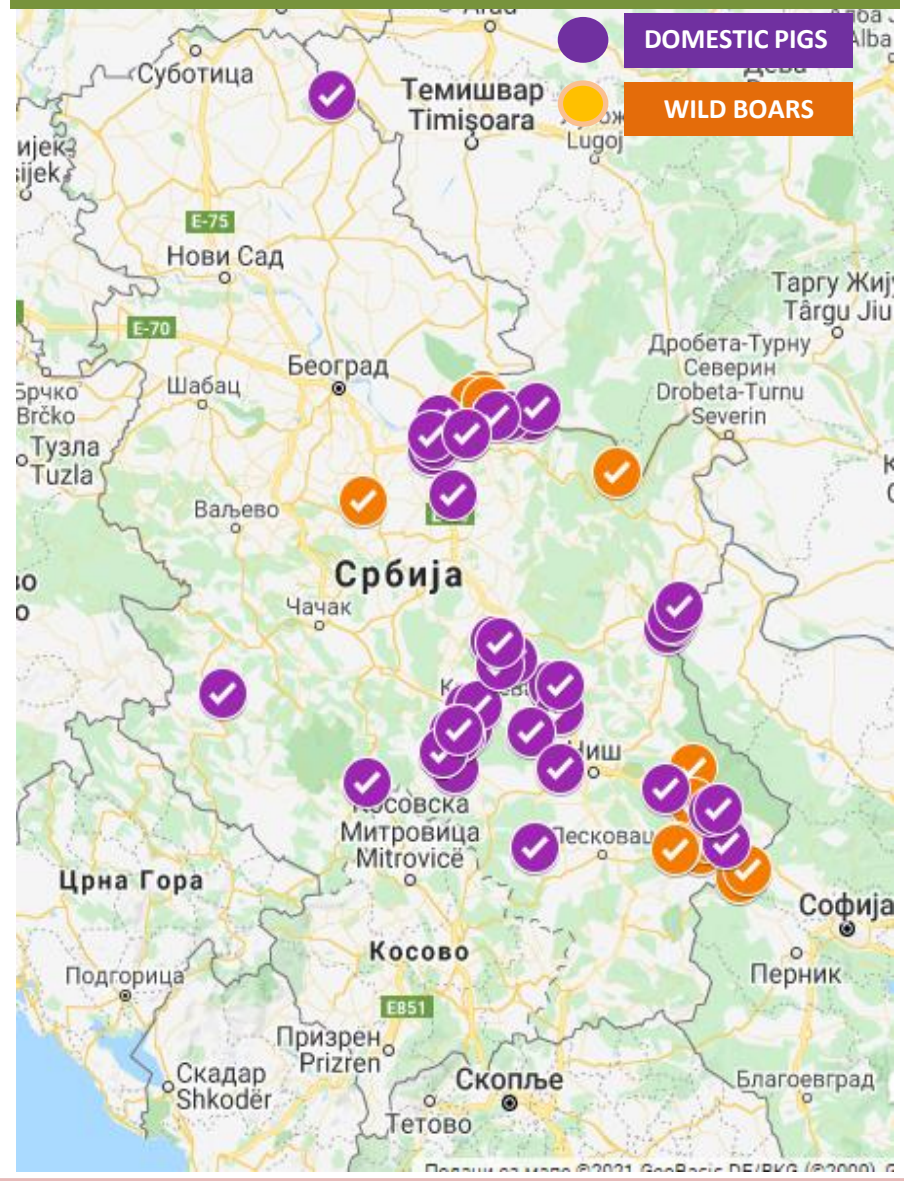
LOCATION OF THE OUTBREAKS

LOCATION OF ALL NEGATIVE SAMPLES

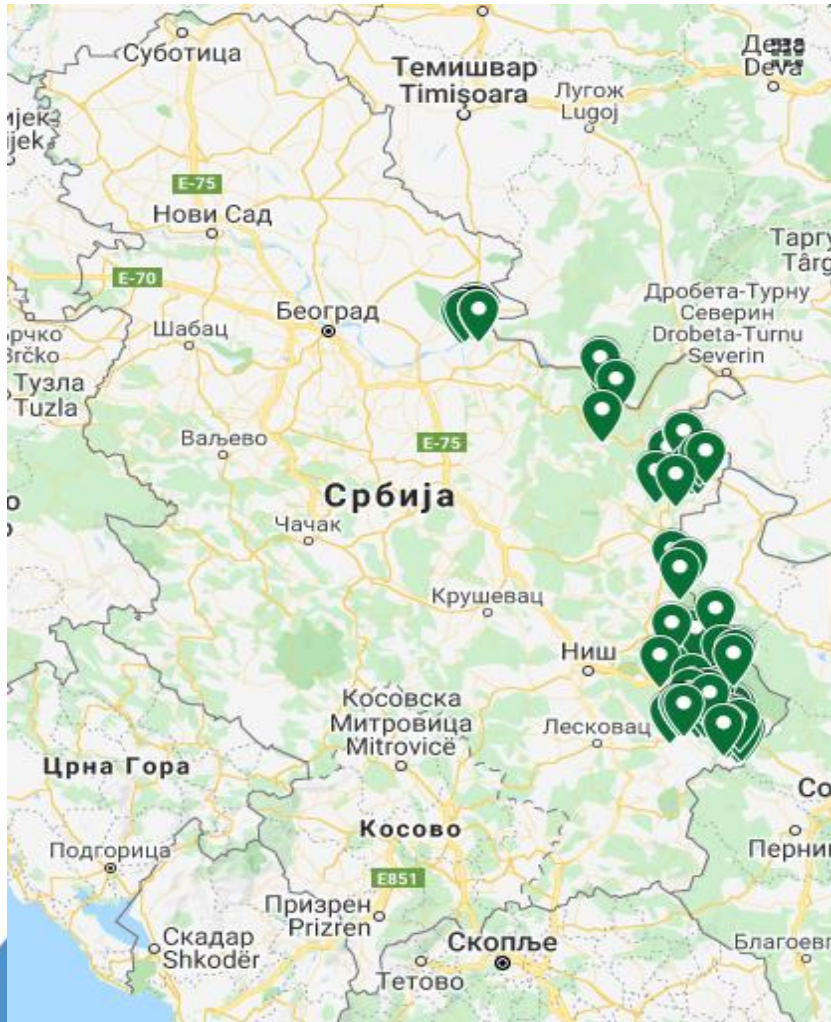

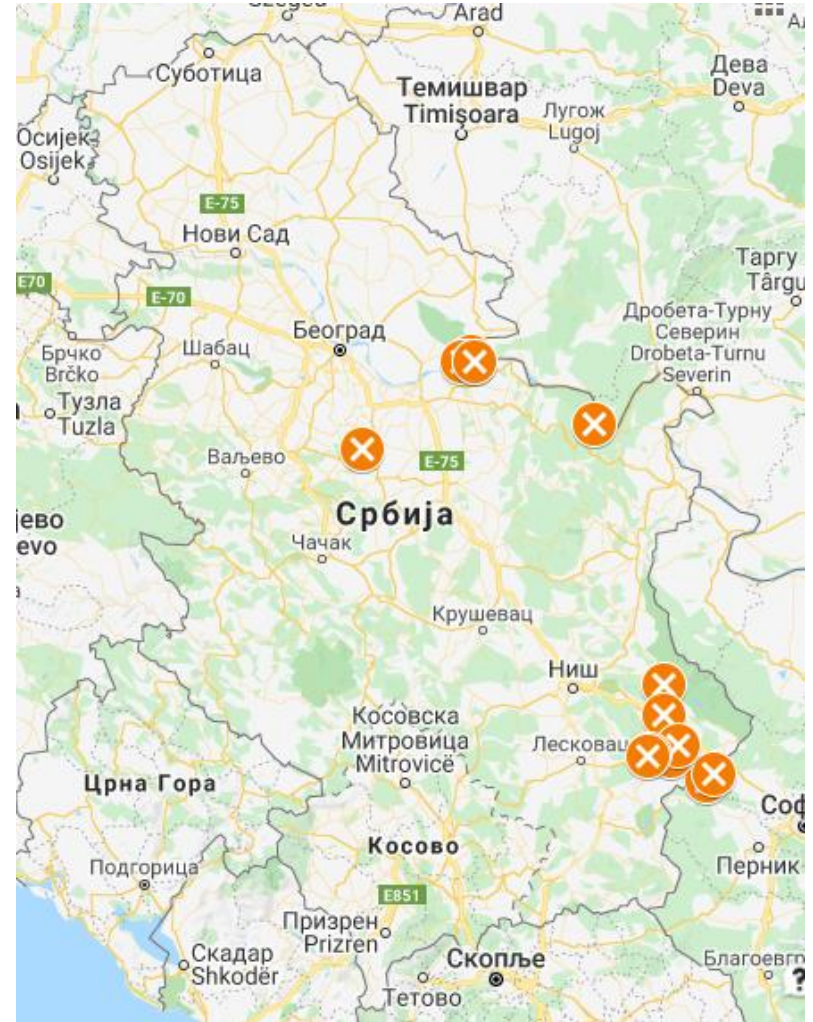

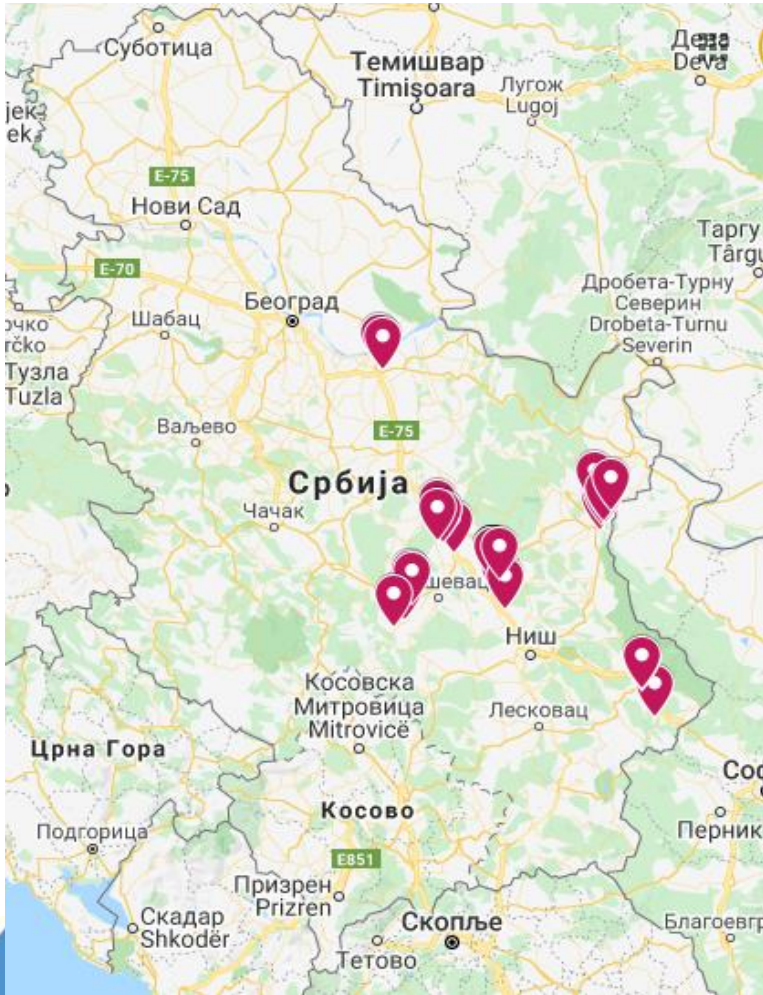

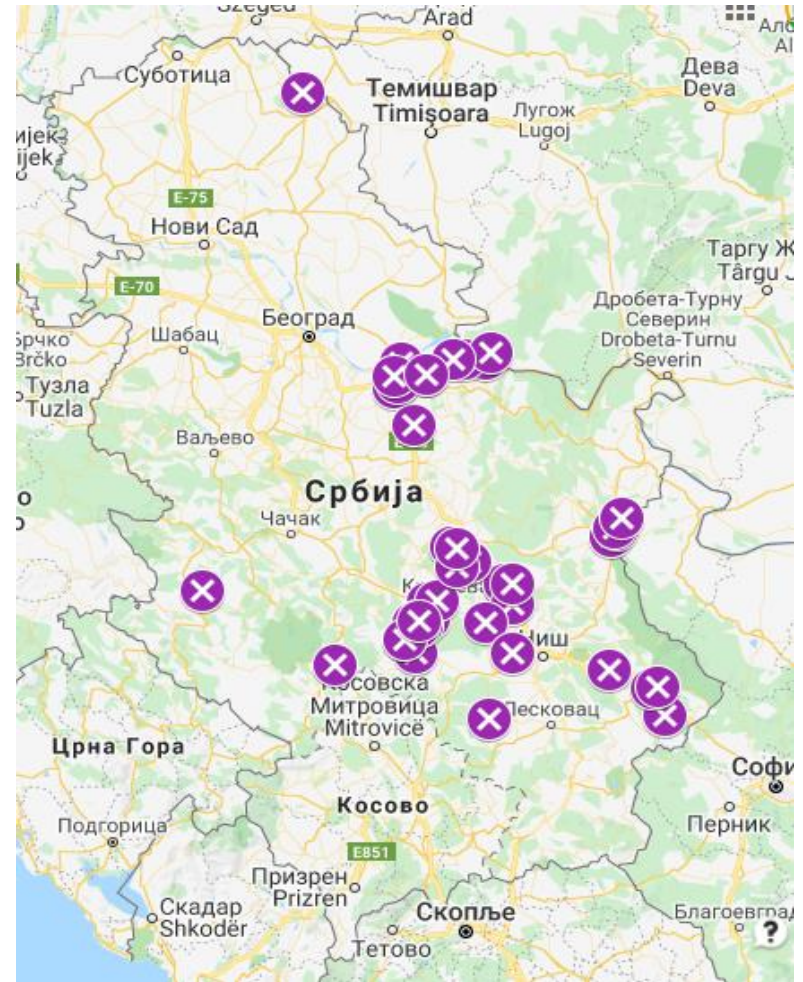


Outbreaks in domestic pigs – country map

location of the outbreaks

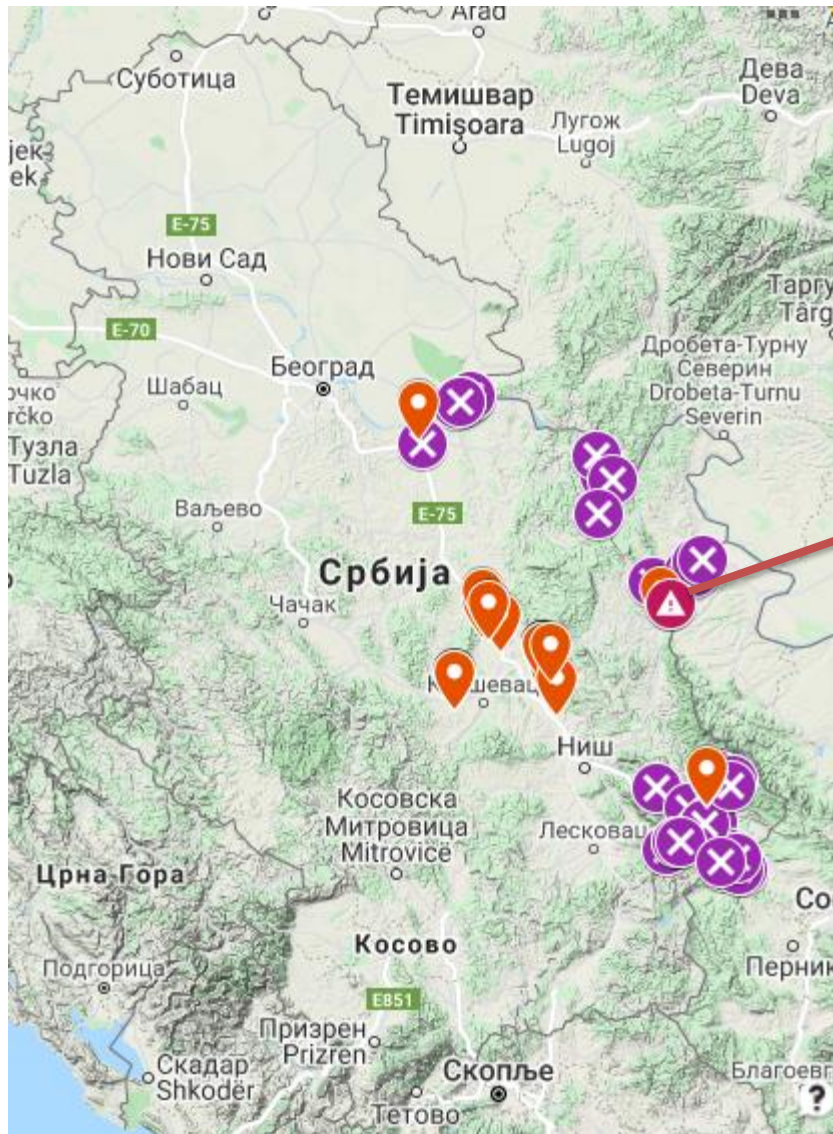


location of all negative samples

How COVID 19 effects on ASF control and eradication measures

Period considered : November 2020 to June 2021

- **No specific influence of COVID 19 on ASF control and eradication measures, but:**
 - The „**Plan of surveillance and diagnostic tests on the ASF in domestic pigs**” was implemented and continuously conducted
 - **The surveillance activities** were according to the National and EU regulation.
 - **Measures and first responders** in case of an outbreak were strict and fast to stop spreading the virus.
 - The veterinary system was in a state of **permanent preparedness**.
 - **Public awareness** (leaflets, brochures, appearances in the media, educations of the farmers, hunters, and veterinarians, press releases...) was continuously conducted
 - **Cooperation and coordination** with the other state institutions were maintained and improved.
 - **Cooperation with other associations** (hunting association, pig producers association, meat industry association) was continuously conducted.
 - **Hunting restriction measures** (to hunt or not to hunt) and all control and surveillance activities in the hunting areas were based on relevant availability of working staff and feasibility to synchronize their duties and responsibilities.
 - **The regional and international corporation** between affected or endangered states was improved and encouraged and the existing mandatory reporting system among EU and third countries.
