Cases in wild boar – Germany



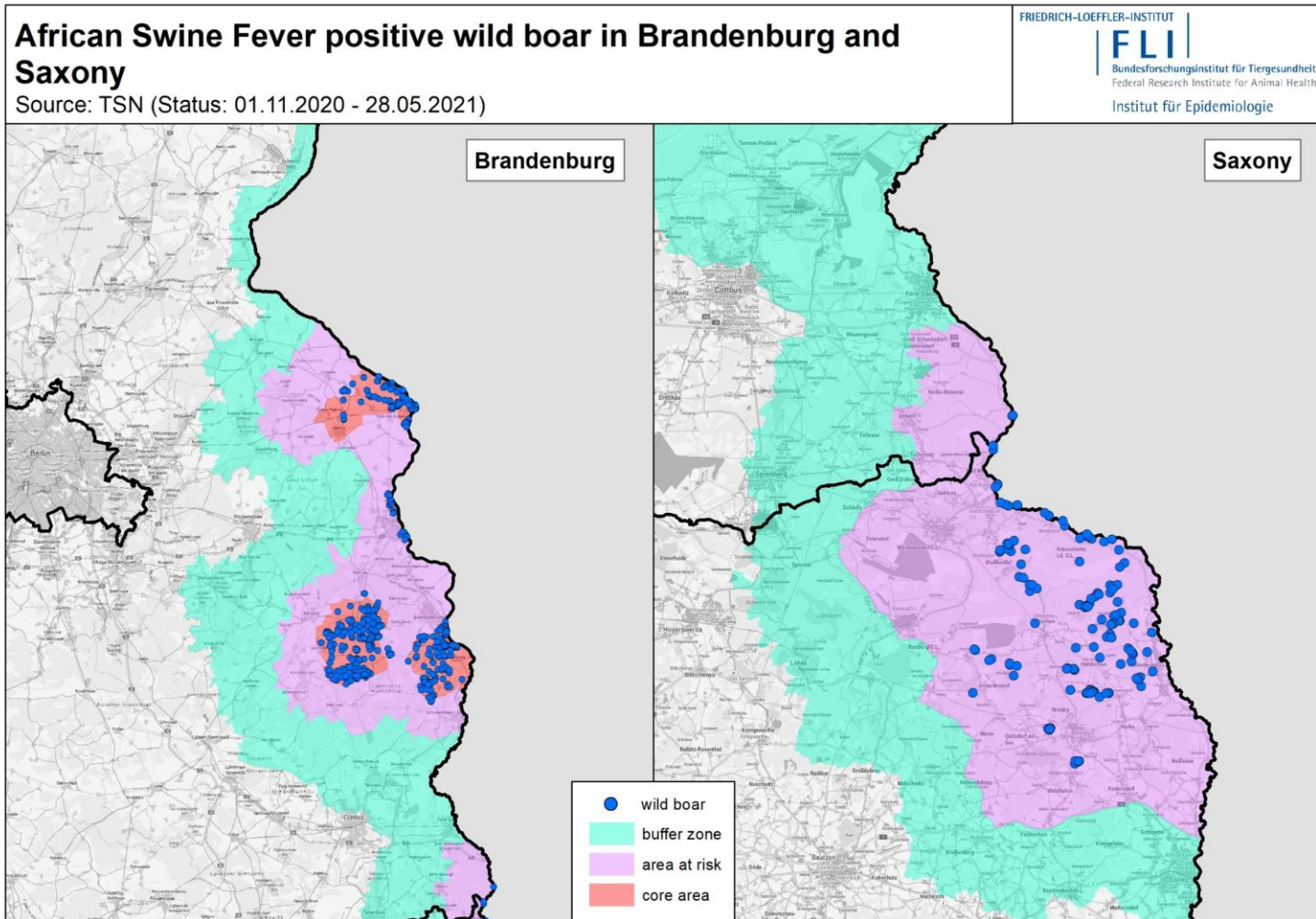
Since 1st November 2020

1087 cases in Brandenburg and Saxony



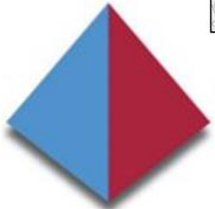
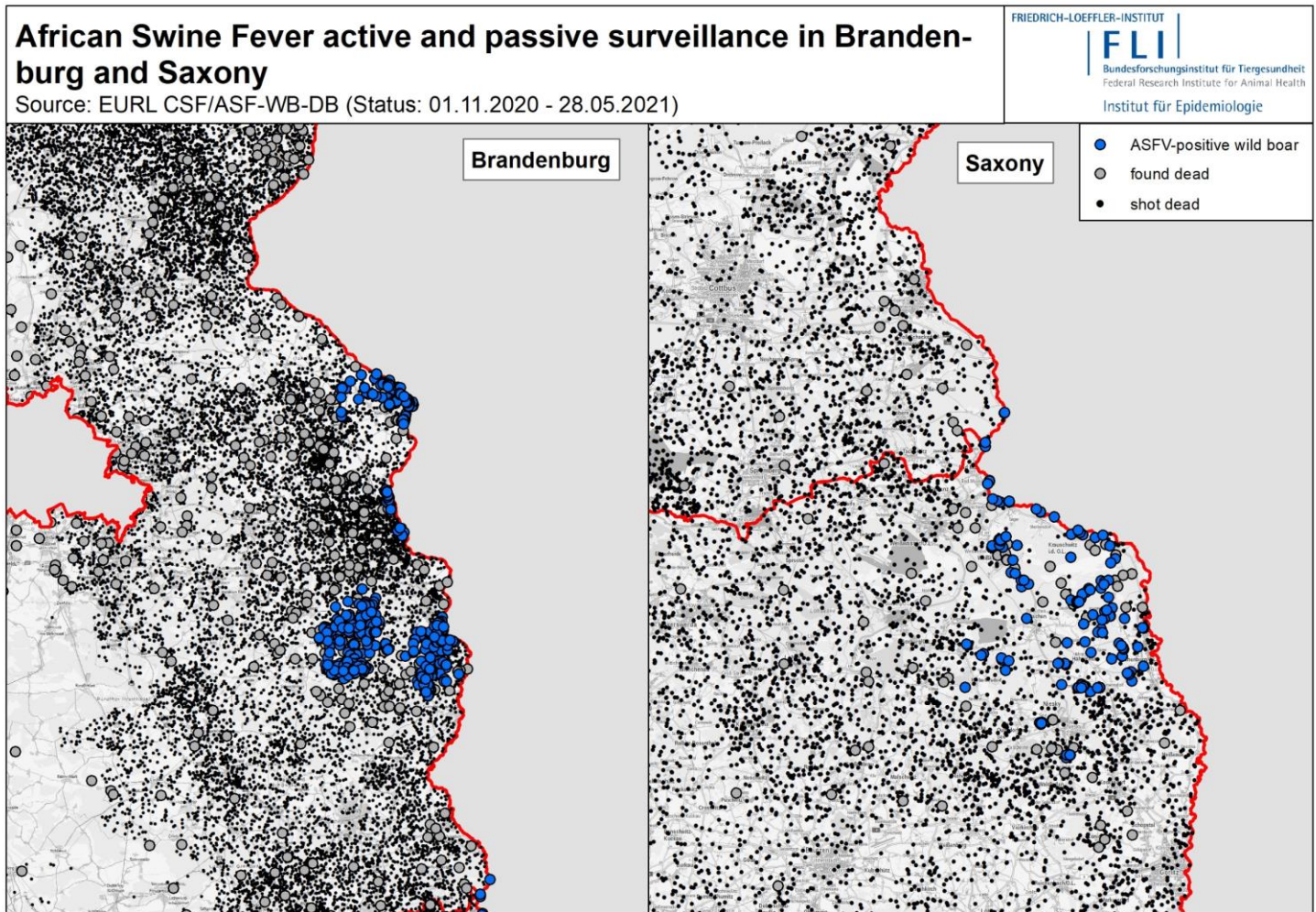
Cases in wild boar – Brandenburg and Saxony

Wild boar - found dead

Period considered	N° wild boar found dead	% PCR positive	% seropositive
November 2020 to May 2021	1467	0	0

Wild boar - hunted

Period considered	N° wild boar hunted	% PCR positive	% seropositive
November 2020 to May 2021	54.141	0	0

In the districts of the country with parts being affected since September 10th 2020

Wild boar - found dead

Period considered	N° wild boar found dead	% PCR positive	% seropositive
November 2020 to May 2021	1193	76.70	3.51

Wild boar - hunted

Period considered	N° wild boar hunted	% PCR positive	% seropositive
November 2020 to May 2021	5463	1.17	0

How COVID 19 effects on ASF control and eradication measures

- Hunting
- Carcass searches
- Building and maintenance of fences
- Laboratory capacities (staff and material)

BUT:

- No qualitative data
- Coincided with HPAI situation
