


Global FMD Control Strategy(June 2012)




GF-TADs FMD RAG Composition-WEA

Regional Epidemiology Network EPINET



Objectives of the Epi Network

- Collect, analyse, and share epidemiological information on the regional occurrence of FMD;
- Promote sharing information on FMD including outbreaks, virus circulation, vaccine selection, vaccination strategies, and vaccine effectiveness;
- Strengthen the competence of epidemiologists within the region to implement FMD and other TADs control activities;
- Ensure cross-border coordination and harmonization of activities;
- Ensure the development of FMD National control plans, SOPs and national FMD strategies in the region.



Activities of the EPINET

- Develop a regional workplan addressing the needs and gaps to implement FMD control strategies;
- Meet (physically or remotely) on regular basis to review progress and agree on network work plan;
- Design and convey trainings and workshops in accordance with the agreed workplan;
- Develop a memorandum of understanding for lab and epi to ensure countries' commitment in support to the network's objectives;
- Develop database for information sharing on FMD and other TADs;
- Facilitate training and scientific exchange on PCP-FMD and FMD epidemiology;
- Provide an annual epidemiological network report to GF-TADs FMD WG;
- Seek funding for the network activities.




- Organize and lead the epidemiological network meetings and facilitate the implementation of the agreed workplan;
- Lead the formulation of a memorandum of understanding to meet the network objectives;
- Analyze the information provided by the region to look for trends and formulate hypothesis to better address challenges within the region;
- Share information in real-time with the points of contact on the FMD situation in the region (early warning) including data on virus circulation, vaccine selection, vaccination strategies, and vaccination monitoring;



Epi Network LeaderTerms of Reference (cont.)

- Provide recommendations to the region on FMD surveillance and epidemiology to assist in the control of FMD;
- Support training based on upon the recommendations provided by the network;
- Prepare and provide an annual epidemiological network report to GF-TADs


Regional Laboratory Network WELNET

Regional Lab Network Objectives

- Share available laboratory information on the regional occurrence and spread of FMDV;
- Provide recommendations on selection of vaccine strains and engage in evaluation of vaccines quality;
- Harmonise FMD diagnostic procedures through the participation in proficiency tests;
- Prepare and exchange reference diagnostic reagents;
- Advocate submission of samples for diagnosis or confirmation to reference laboratories;
- Encourage accreditation of diagnostic procedures by national or international accreditation body;
- Promote the implementation of the international lab biosafety and biosecurity standards;
- Increase competency of national laboratories and identify constraints and to propose solutions.




- Meet to review progress and to agree on work plan of the network;
- Provide an annual network report to GF-TADs FMD WG;
- Develop a memorandum of understanding for lab and epi to ensure countries' commitment in support to the network's objectives;
- Develop processes based on best practices to achieve equivalence in FMD laboratory outputs and follow the international standards of diagnostic procedures and biosafety and biosecurity;
- Agree to the exchange of materials and data between national laboratories;
- Connect with the OIE-FAO reference laboratory network for exchange of information and expertise;
- Facilitate training and scientific exchange on FMD laboratory activities; and
- Seek funding for the network activities.



Lab Network Leader Terms of Reference

- Organize laboratory network meetings and facilitate the implementation of the agreed workplan;
- Lead the formulation of a memorandum of understanding to meet the network objectives;
- Assist in the evaluation of capacity/capabilities and performance of the center laboratories within the region;
- Offer expertise to the region on diagnostics to assist in the control of FMD;
- Provide recommendations on vaccine strain selection for implementation of control plans;



Lab Network Leader Terms of Reference (cont.)

- Share information in real-time with the points of contact on the incursion of new virus strain in the region (early warning);
- Facilitate training and workshop on diagnostics per the agreed workplan;
- Assist in submission of diagnostic samples for virus characterization and vaccine matching;
- Provide SOPs and protocols to harmonize the laboratory results;
- Coordinate and prepare proficiency test scheme for the region; and
- Participate in the annual OIE-FAO FMD reference laboratory network.



ToRs- Epi & Lab Network Leaders During the roadmap meetings

- Review and assess the PCP- FMD stage of the countries;
- Deliver a presentation on activities and advancement of the network towards the regional priorities and workplan;
- Lead the discussion on the regional needs in epidemiology and laboratory diagnosis to update the workplan;
- Work closely with the FMD WG and RAG on the delivery of the regional priorities;
- Advise on issues or factors preventing effective progress along the FMD roadmap.




Regional Leading Laboratory Terms of Reference

- 1. Communicate with the national laboratories on the services they can provide
- 2. Development of technical reference documents (manuals, SOPs, guidelines)
- 3. Provides training to national laboratories (train the trainers approach)
- 4. Provide diagnostic service and technical advice on diagnostics to countries in the region
- 5. Advocate national labs to submit samples to FAO/OIE reference centers for full characterization
- 6. Coordinates proficiency testing for the region (limited to screening tests)
- 7. Assist in the procurement/production and/or maintenance of stock reagents
- 8. Participates in regional laboratory network activities (potential leader)
- 9. Links with the regional epidemiology network

Regional Leading Laboratory Selection Criteria

- 1. Creditability and accepted by countries of the region
- Commitment from the government to support and sustain lab functions as described in the terms of reference
- 3. Lab capacity and capability to perform diagnostics for FMD/PPR/other TADs
- 4. Capability to handle exotic viruses from other countries in the region
- 5. Certification to ship and receive international diagnostic samples
- 6. Participated or willingness to take part in OIE twinning program
- 7. Keen interest to be designated as a **FAO/OIE reference center**
- 8. Established link with FMD reference laboratory
- 9. Maintain good performance on proficiency testing carried by reference center
