<u>Reminder :</u>

Europe 53 were expected in 2021 to suggest priority topics for the General session in 2023.

- There is no more selection of a Technical Item for the GS two years ahead
- Instead, Delegates select <u>three Strategic Topics of global interest</u> to be addressed by the OIE through various means (OIE scientific review, newsletter, workshops, seminars, ...).
- Every Delegate has the possibility to select up to three Topics of interest and a poll is made.
- Ideas were received from the RCG and online consultation of the 53 members in 2021.
- The aim is to have more flexibility overall.





Training Veterinary Services

Good global health governance is dependent on high-performing animal health systems and, thus, on well-trained Veterinary Services. The OIE has developed its platform to help Veterinary Services personnel update their knowledge and acquire new skills.

The platform is almed primarily at Veterinary Services: the public and private bodies that are responsible for **animal health and welfare** and **veterinary public health.** They include veterinarians and veterinary paraprofessionals, but also large numbers of other professionals. The platform will also be of interest to private sector professionals, students, journalists and other civil society actors.

A key element of global health governance

Animal disease surveillance and the inspection of products destined for human consumption are just some of the responsibilities of Veterinary Services. Their skills are essential to the **long-term success of health policies**. The platform aims to provide them with the skills necessary to implement the OIF's International Standards and recommendations. ary Meeting global challenges



Platform mechanism



One Health

The "One Health" concept summarised an idea that had been known for more than a century; that human health and animal health are interdependent and bound to the health of the ecosystems in which they exist. We envisaged and implemented it as a collaborative global approach to understanding risks for human and animal health and ecosystem health as a whole.

Global health risks and tomorrow's challenges

Diseases of animal origin that are transmissible to humans, such as avian influenza, rabies, Rift Valley fever and brucellosis, pose worldwide risks to public health that must be prevented and controlled.

Pathogens of animal origin that are not transmissible to humans, but which have a severe impact on the production of animal protein, should not be neglected either, particularly in developing countries. In fact, they can lead to production losses and a reduction in the available food supply, leading to serious **public health** problems caused by food shortages and protein deficiencies.

These risks are increasing with trade **globalisation**, global warming and changes in human behaviour, all of which provide multiple opportunities for pathogens to **colonise** new territories and evolve into new forms.



World Health

- 60% of pathogens that cause human diseases come from domectic animals or wildlife.
- 75% of emerging human pathogens are of animal origin.
- 80% of pathogens that are of concern for bioterrorism originate in animals



Food Security Environment

- Understanding the connections between biodiversity, ecosystems and infectious diseases is crucial.
- Meanwhile, **more than 20%** of animal production losses in the world are linked to animal diseases.

Economy

- Animal diseases pose a direct threat to the incomes of rural communities that depend on livestock production.
- More than 75% ^[2] of the billion people in the world who live on less than \$2 per day depend on subsistence farming and raising livestock to survive.




Disease surveillance and national reporting




The three most important barriers to aquatic animal disease surveillance and data collection at national/central level




Reporting to the OIE




The three most important barriers to aquatic animal disease notification to the OIE




Implementation of Chapter 4.1. on Biosecurity adopted in 2021






