










HPAI Poultry Outbreaks - 2021/2022 Season

- **Poultry-dense region**
- 6 outbreaks in IE
 - First outbreak confirmed November 20th 2021
 - Last outbreak confirmed December 20th 2021

6 outbreaks in NI

- Some zones spanned both jurisdictions
- **Co-operation and collaboration with DAERA** colleagues
- **Stamping out policy**
- **3km Protection/ 10km Surveillance Zones**
- Certain requirements e.g. Movement licencing, designation of meat plants, hatcheries & egg packing centres, surveillance & sampling





Planning, Preparing and Collecting

- Starts before a outbreak ever occurs **Background relationships, communications,** cross border collaboration
- Surveillance* Effective
- Record-keeping
- **Previously published dossiers**

Simple language

- Translation
- What do you want the reader to know –make it easy
- **Reference back to relevant Chapters/Articles in TAHC**
- **Hyperlinks**
- Annexes

- Measures implemented to maintain freedom
- Conclusion*

Challenges – and how we resolved them

Support from Status Department

Lessons learned from previous submission

- **Be faithful to SOP/TAHC requirements**
- **Don't forget about importation requirements etc**
- **Describe surveillance around demonstrating absence of infection Describe approach to seropositive lab results**
- **Record keeping** -stay mindful of self-declaration requirements even when still dealing with outbreaks -importance of date of C&D of last infected premises
