


LSD in the world


- LSD is endemic in most African countries.
- Since 2012, it has spread rapidly to the Middle East, Southeast Europe, and Western and Central Asia (15 countries reported the first occurrence of the disease to WOAH between 2012 and 2018 in these regions).
- Since 2019, several outbreaks of LSD have been reported by Members in Asia, and recently, in Southeast Asia (between 2019 and 2022, 20 countries and territories have notified the first occurrence of LSD to WOAH).



117 WOAH-listed diseases + 3 emerging diseases in 2023

Based on WOAH Animal Health Codes:

- Six-monthly reports: known situation of all WOAH-listed diseases in all countries over time (aggregated information)
- **Immediate notifications** and weekly **follow-up reports**: exceptional events, alert and response (detailed information)



- Geographical scope: global 218 reporting countries and territories
- Time scope: 2005-present

Information on **183 diseases** of terrestrial and aquatic animals

More than 3.8 million outbreaks and 7.8 billion cases recorded in the database, with geographical, temporal, quantitative details and epidemiological information

Ensure transparency in the global animal disease situation

Each Member Country undertakes to report the animal diseases that it detects on its territory. WOAH then disseminates the information to other countries, which can take the necessary preventive action. This information also includes diseases transmissible to humans and the intentional introduction of pathogens. Information is sent out immediately or periodically depending on the seriousness of the disease. This objective applies to disease occurrences both naturally occurring and deliberately caused. Dissemination is via <u>distribution list</u>, and the <u>World Animal Health Information</u> System Interface.







One Health principle

WAHIS is an **essential** source of information for other systems. With official validated information provided by WOAH Members, WAHIS re-enforces its role as the **reference database for animal and zoonotic disease information worldwide**.

ADIS-WAHIS interconnection

WAHIS will interconnect with the **EC Animal Disease Information System (ADIS)** in Q3 of 2023 as a proof of concept for **single entry reporting by EU countries**. A joint ADIS/WAHIS digital webinar was held on 13-14 December 2022 and further training is anticipated in 2023.

Global Data Sharing

Work is ongoing to interconnect with other data bases in 2023. The approach taken has changed slightly: the concept is to **make data available from a variety of WOAH data bases** (including WAHIS) via a data warehousing option.
