I. Understanding country situation

National strategy (Legal basis)


- 1. Government Emergency Ordinance No 155/2001/ on the approval of the programme for the management of stray dogs, as amended and supplemented.
- 2. Government Decision no. 1059/2013 for approving the methodological norms of application for Government Emergency Ordinance no. 155/2001.

In accordance with these rules <u>local authorities</u> have the obligation to establish, depending on the needs, specialized services for the management of stray dogs.

Also, <u>local authorities</u> have the obligation to arrange and supplement from their own funds public shelters for stray dogs.

II. Control measures

1. Mandatory - dog identification and registration (under the responsibility of the owners).

National database – 4,145,271 owned dogs (june 2023)

2. Reproductiv control – sterilization is mandatory for all dogs belonging to common breed and their crossbreds and also for dangerous breeds (Pitbull, Bandog, etc.).



III. Monitoring and evaluation

- a) Annual monitoring of the activity of local councils,
- b) The introduction of checks in the annual control plans for persons who own a large number of dogs (ex. more than 15).



IV. Rabies dimension

| Year | Dogs (domestic/stray) | Bovines | Foxies |
|------|-----------------------|---------|--------|
| 2021 | - | 4 | 1 |
| 2022 | 6 | 15 | 7 |
| 2023 | 2 | 7 | 7 |

- ► National strategy for prevention in dogs and for wildelife, co-funded from the E.U.
- ► Anti- rabies vaccination is mandatory and free of charge



V. Country roadmap Key Actions

National strategy update:

- a) The identification of owned dogs becomes free of charge and is supported by the state budget,
- b) The involvement of multiple institutions (local councils, regional authorities, NGO `s) in the sterilization of owned dogs, especially in rural areas.
- c) The introduction of additional responsibilities for public television and public radio, regarding responsible ownership of pets.
