

DISASTER RESPONSE

Founded in 1969, IFAW runs animal welfare, wildlife conservation and education programs with partners in more than 40 countries.



Emergency Relief Networks

- Emergency Relief Network (ERN) model to expand our capacity through relationships with response partners (groups, networks, agencies, organisations, and contractors)
- Purpose: improving standards for emergency relief (best practices) and promoting disaster risk reduction planning
- ERN members: trained on disaster management/technical rescue and equipped to respond to animals impacted by disasters (workshops for team leaders and/or responders)





Implementation of the OIE Guidelines

- Facilitating the implementation of the OIE Guidelines on disaster management and risk reduction in relation to animal health and welfare and veterinary public health in EU Member States or European countries
- → Legislative Framework
- → Communications between stakeholders
- → Training and Education
- → Integration and Coordination of plans into frameworks
- → Post-disaster evaluations

- 3 Year plan (2017-2019)

Year 1: Elaboration of the contingency plan (1st Disaster Risk Management Workshop)

Year 2: Adoption of the contingency plans

Year 3: Field simulation exercises to test out the plans in real conditions

- Advanced planning
 - → evacuation plan, stickers, neighbours
- Specific advice for other animals (horses, rabbits, fish, reptiles)
- Proper identification
- Preparing a pet survival kit in advance
- Transport equipment and cage furnishing
- If you can evacuate with your pets, do it!

Situations eligible

Any man-made or natural disaster impacting animals where physical or financial assistance is needed to support local response and recovery.

- e.g. of man-made disasters: political conflict, financial crisis, large scale cruelty case.
- e.g. of natural disasters: extreme weather event, earthquake, wildfire, flood.

Criteria used to evaluate proposals

- For registered non-profit organisations or verified agencies
- Description of how animals are impacted by the disaster
- Clear description of how the organisation's capacity and capabilities to support a response
- Proposal of a clear and efficient response plan and budget.
- Monitoring and Evaluation of the response plan
