

## Situations eligible

- support local response and recovery.
- e.g. of man-made disasters: political conflict, financial crisis, large scale cruelty case.
- e.g. of natural disasters: extreme weather event, earthquake, wildfire, flood.

## Criteria used to evaluate proposals

- For registered non-profit organisations or verified agencies
- Description of how animals are impacted by the disaster
- Clear description of how the organisation's capacity and capabilities to support a response
- Proposal of a clear and efficient response plan and budget.
- Monitoring and Evaluation of the response plan

Any man-made or natural disaster impacting animals where physical or financial assistance is needed to



## **Emergency Relief Networks**

- Emergency Relief Network (ERN) model to expand our capacity through relationships with response partners (groups, networks, agencies, organisations, and contractors)
- Triple purpose:
- improving standards for emergency relief
- establishing best practices 2.
- promoting disaster risk reduction planning 3.
- ERN members: trained on disaster management/technical rescue and equipped to respond to animals impacted by disasters (workshops for team leaders and/or responders)


