

I am honoured to introduce this newsletter, which presents the results achieved by the OIE Platform on Animal Welfare for Europe in 2017 and its activities planned for 2018. Animal welfare is of great importance for the European Union (EU). The EU actively supports the OIE standard setting process and is a major donor in order to support the implementation of OIE standards globally and particularly in Europe.

The European Commission is a member of the Steering Group of the OIE Platform on Animal Welfare for Europe. It has achieved remarkable results in 2017, in particular concerning animal welfare during transport and at slaughter, as well as on stray dog population control. New priority areas are envisaged in the second Action Plan including animals in disasters and working equids. We look forward to continuing supporting the OIE in its European activities with even closer cooperation, as to raise animal welfare standards in the Region.

This can only be achieved with the active commitment of all of us and I am sure that we will all contribute to make Europe a model for the rest of the world.



After the successful completion of the first Action Plan end of 2016, Member Countries in Europe have reiterated their confidence in the OIE Platform by unanimously adopting its 2<sup>nd</sup> Action Plan during the 85<sup>th</sup> OIE General Session in May 2017. This 2<sup>nd</sup> Action Plan, covering 2017-2019 was prepared in close consultation with Member Countries and stakeholders.

It provides full continuity while incorporating two new topics (the welfare of working equids and disaster management) to reflect ongoing work and the socio-cultural situation in Europe, especially in the context of climate change.

WHAT'S NEXT?

In total, 190 K€ were disbursed for the implementation of activities planned in Year 1 under the 2nd Action Plan (2017).

Half of the funds (50%) were disbursed for long distance transport activities, a topic that had not been addressed in the first Action Plan.

The European Commission, Germany, Ireland, Switzerland, Italy, RSPCA and the International Coalition for the welfare of Working Equids have provided financial support to these activities through the OIE World Animal Health and Welfare Fund.
