
STOP AFRICAN SWINE FEVER

African swine fever (ASF) is a highly contagious disease that **affects wild boar and domestic pigs**. It is **harmless to humans** but can have devastating social and economic consequences in countries where it is present.

Humans can easily and unknowingly spread the disease when they come into contact with an infected animal or infected materials.



Hunters like you can help stop the spread of this deadly disease by reporting suspicious cases and remember:





Never approach a dead or sick wild boar, keep your distance and report it to local authorities as soon as possible.



Thoroughly disinfect your equipment before leaving hunting areas.



Do not leave wild boar offal or waste in forests or fields.



Do not feed game meat to animals.



Avoid visiting pig farms after hunting.

There is currently no approved vaccine for ASF in Europe, so **prevention** measures are the only way to stop the spread of this deadly disease.

Do your part to protect wild boar, domestic pigs and the people whose livelihood depends on them. Together, we can stop the spread of ASF.
