ADDED VALUE FOR THE WOAH EUROPEAN REGION: special attention to the needs of countries willing to empower WOAH standards






The consortium

- Chairperson among the committee members from IZS Teramo/SCAW.





IZS Teramo SCAW CC Activity



- Contributing to the WOAH Platform on Animal Welfare for Europe compliance with WOAH standards on animal welfare.
- Maintaining the WOAH **Network of Animal Welfare Collaborating Centres** in order to seek for collaboration opportunities with other centres of expertise.
- Highlighting the importance of animal welfare when implementing the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- Contributing, via workshops, publications and courses, to the general knowledge about the link between good animal husbandry and efficient preventive veterinary medicine and the effects not only on animal health but also on animal welfare in general.
- Establishing a knowledge exchange platform for sustainable animal transport.
- Identify areas where knowledge is insufficient and **contribute to research and advice** related to animal welfare at **slaughter**.
- Providing scientific and technical training to personnel from WOAH members in the field of animal welfare (e.g. Twinning project with Tunisia)

Quantifying the strengths of the links between improving animal welfare and achieving the different SDGs

Interaction	Name	Explanation
+3	Indivisible	Inextricably linked to the achievement of another goal
+2	Reinforcing	Aids the achievement of another goal
+1	Enabling	Creates conditions that further another goal
0	Consistent	No significant positive or negative interactions
-1	Constraining	Limits options on another goal
-2	Counteracting	Clashes with another goal
-3	Cancelling	Makes it impossible to reach another goal

- Establishment of a permanent training centre on AW
- Support the development of revised AW legislation based on WOAH TAHC
- Networking with other North African countries (Algeria, Morocco, Libya, Mauritania)
- Final meeting and North African Meeting on Animal Welfare was carried out in Tunis 11-14 June

Main objective

Improve the technical knowledge and skills of the National School of Veterinary Medicine (ENMV) in the field of animal welfare, and support it in the process that will eventually lead to acquire the status of WOAH CC for Animal Welfare in the North African Sub-region
