



to improve animal welfare in all 53 countries of Europe and empower Veterinary Services to take action on animal welfare in compliance with **WOAH** standards






National Contact Points on long distance transportation for Europe







The Observatory developing a thematic study on the implementation of standards related to transport of live animals at global level



Animal welfare during transport by land and sea: level of implementation of WOAH standards and challenges faced

- Assess to what extent the standards related to transport of live animals are implemented in WOAH Members;
- Seek for feedback on Members' overall experience with these standards (what factors facilitate their implementation versus what barriers prevent their implementation);
- Inform standard revision process of the Code commission.



Animal welfare during transport by land and sea: level of implementation of WOAH standards and challenges faced

A survey targeting the Veterinary Services of WOAH Members to assess the level of implementation of WOAH standards related to animal welfare during transport

Interviews and/or focus groups to explore the barriers to the uptake of these standards as well as the success factors with Veterinary Services of WOAH Members;

A survey targeting the private sector, with a similar aim.



Animal welfare during transport by land and sea: level of implementation of WOAH standards and challenges faced

- Provide a dashboard presenting these results with a regional filter
- Identifying different profiles of Members based on several criteria, e.g. regulatory enforcement mechanisms, and the level of prioritization.
- Conducting focus groups/interviews with samples of Members corresponding to identify success factors and barriers to the implementation of WOAH standards
- Producing comprehensive report.
