

#### **WOAH VEE Twinning programme**



- •"Twinning": a mechanism for improving institutional capacity and expertise in developing and intransition countries
- •Facilitates the *exchange* of knowledge, staff, students, ideas and experience between Veterinary Education Establishments



#### **WOAH VEE Twinning programme**

#### **Objectives:**

- modernise veterinary curriculum and the way it is delivered
- improve alignment with WOAH guidelines and recommendations on veterinary education
- foster a better understanding of the threshold of initial veterinary education worldwide
- ensure a more balanced distribution of knowledge and expertise in developed and developing countries

Impact on the curriculum rather than on a cohort of students



#### **WOAH VEE Twinning programme**

- A partnership between a recognised Veterinary Education
   Establishment known as the 'Parent' and a 'Beneficiary' Veterinary
   Education Establishment
- Objectives jointly agreed on by the WOAH, Directors/Deans of the Parent and Beneficiary Establishments - endorsed by the Delegates to the WOAH of the countries concerned
- Duration: minimum of 2 years and maximum of 3 years (extensions may be envisaged)



#### **Project Actors**

#### The Parent Establishment:

- is accountable and responsible for the implementation and use of the financial resources provided
- prepares and transmits the interim, annual and final technical/financial reports to the OIE
- The Beneficiary Establishment
- The WOAH



- Ideally, the relationship between Parent and Beneficiary should be built on collaborative and mutually beneficial programmes
- The benefits from a twinning project should continue long after the project and lead to the further development of veterinary and educational expertise in the region

- Strong ownership of projects
- In-kind effects leveraged by projects to increase funding and benefits
- Engagement of governments and stakeholders
- Curriculum assessment tools developed
- Curricular reform undertaken with development of curricula to achieve WOAH Day 1 Competencies
- Improved teaching methodologies adopted
- Special 2020 issue of Journal of Veterinary Medical Education on the WOAH VEE Twinning Programme
- First step to international accreditation (EAEVE)



### VPP Educational Institution Twinning?

 The VEE Twinning Programme offers a model for improving VPP education and promoting adoption of WOAH VPP Competencies and Curricula
