## FVE's mission

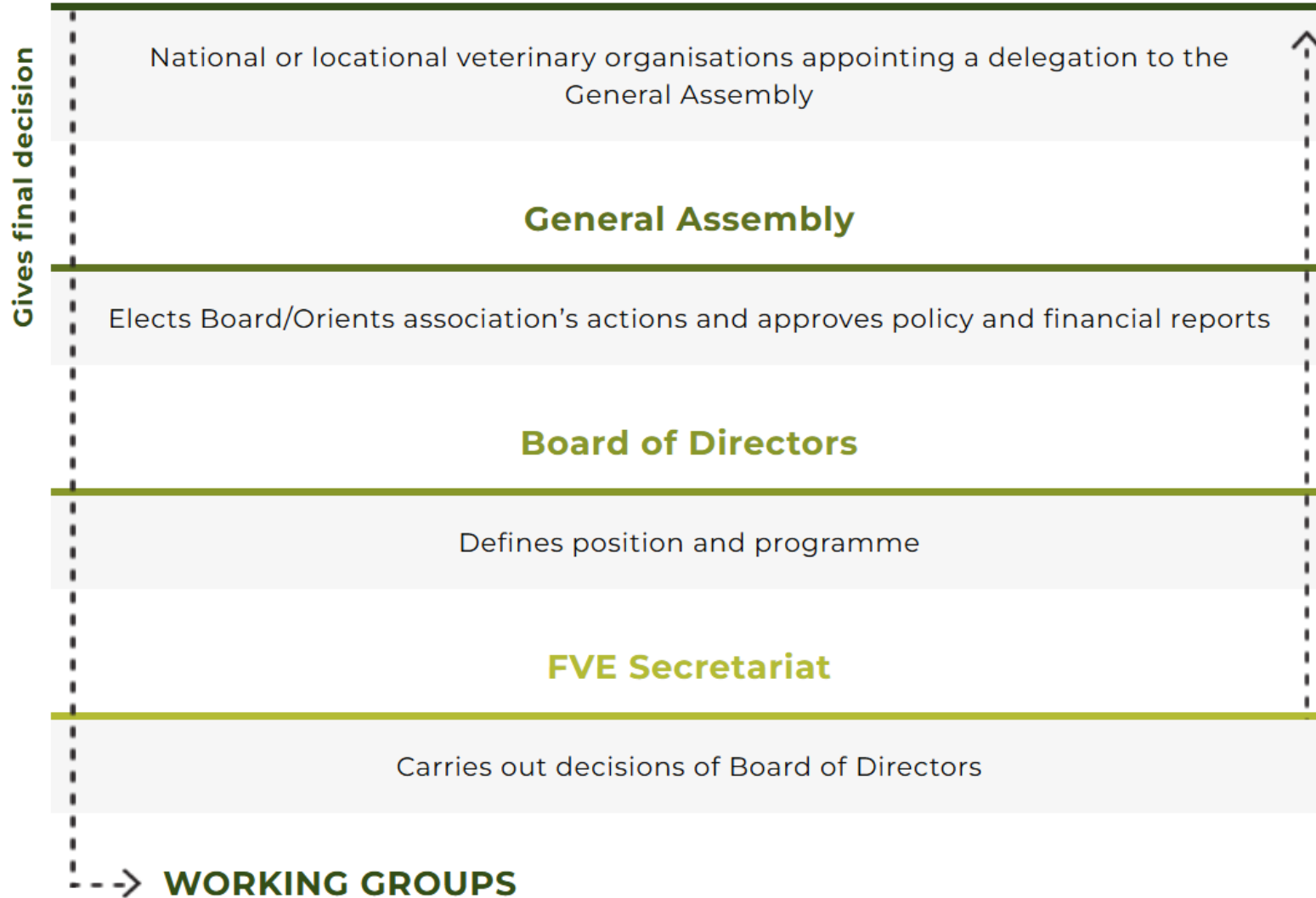
The European veterinary profession, embodied by FVE, enhances animal health, animal welfare, public health and protect the environment by promoting the veterinary profession.

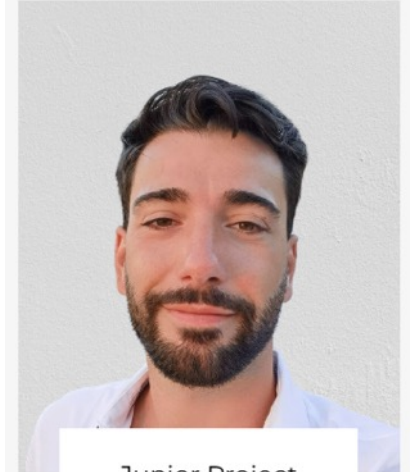

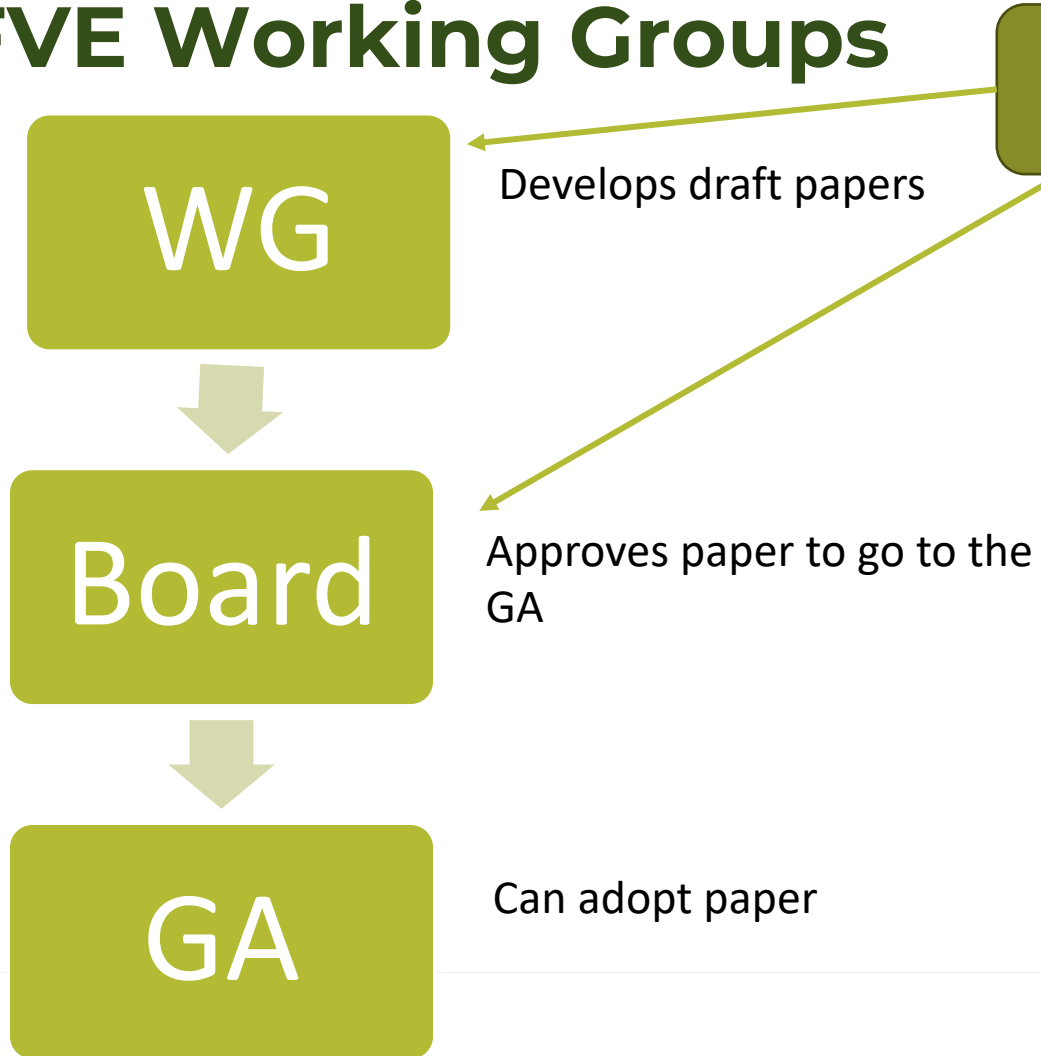
