IFRC's approach to Global Health Security

Vision

Strengthen the ability of communities, National Societies and other partners to prevent, detect and respond to disease threats and prepare for future risks.

Expected Outcomes

Resilient communities: Local communities have the necessary knowledge and demonstrate capacity to effectively prevent, detect, report and respond early to outbreaks.

Resilient National Societies: The NS's have a recognized role in epidemic preparedness and response, have adopted a holistic view of hazard risk management.

Resilient Societies: Key stakeholders understand the role they can play and are actively involved in epidemic risk management.



A whole of society, multi-hazard and community centered epidemic/pandemic preparedness & response

What is community-based surveillance and why are we talking about it?

CBS is the systematic detection and reporting significant public health events within a community by community members*



- CBS can extend existing human health and animal health surveillance systems – beyond health facility
- Practical application of One Health approach
- Opportunity to link surveillance with community actions
- Early warning leads to early action which results in lives saved
- Community volunteers identify and report on simple health risks of public health concern (they do not need to be medically trained)

Epidemic and pandemic preparedness programmes using a One Health approach:



- National Societies have an auxiliary role to public authorities
- Three- year programme in Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan, implemented by IFRC and Red Crescent Societies of Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan
- Supported by DG ECHO and Red Cross partners (Italian Red Cross, Finnish Red Cross and German Red Cross)
- In Tajikistan, additionally supported by USAID.







Achievements in Kyrgyzstan:



- Risk communication and community engagement activities by trained Red Crescent volunteers.
- Educating the public about priority zoonotic diseases such as echinococcosis, alveococcosis, brucellosis, rabies, anthrax and encouraging people to vaccinate their animals.
- Reached over 90,000 people (October 2023-April 2024)







Achievements in Kyrgyzstan:



- Piloting of Community- based Surveillance (CBS) in two districts in Talas and Jalal-Abad regions, with a focus on zoonotic diseases.
- Planned to sign tri-partite memorandum of understanding between the Ministry of Health, Ministry of Agriculture and Red Crescent Society of Kyrgyzstan on joint collaboration.
- A member of the Country's One Health Technical Working Group.







Achievements in Tajikistan:



- Piloting Community- based Surveillance in five districts in RRS and Sughd regions, with a focus on zoonotic diseases (rabies, anthrax, etc.)
- Close collaboration with the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Agriculture.
- Risk communication and community engagement activities by trained community volunteers.
- Educating the public about priority zoonotic diseases and encouraging them to vaccinate their animals.
- Reached over 5,000 people in 2023.
