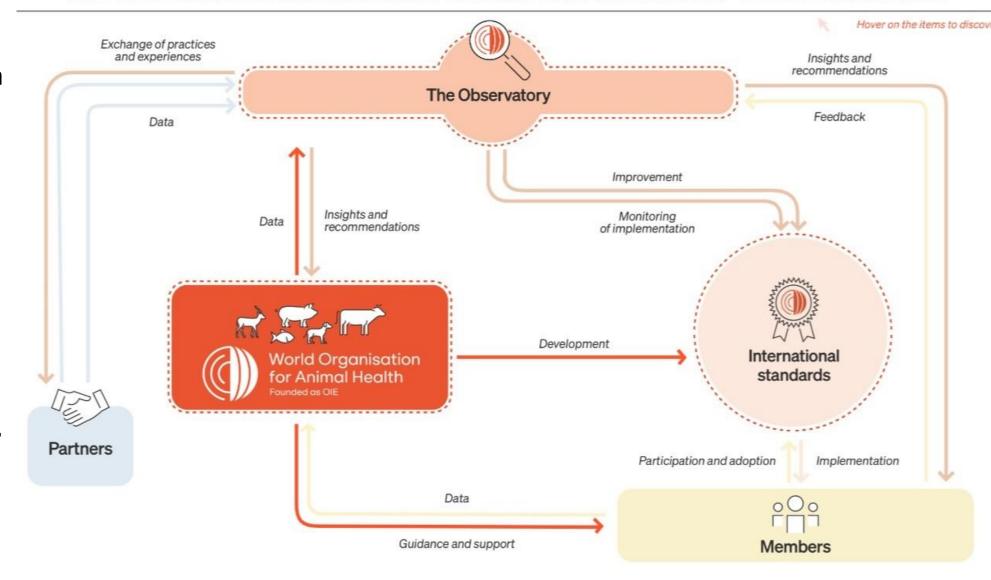




# What is the Observatory?

The Observatory is a continuous and systematic mechanism designed to analyse the implementation of our international standards by using information regularly collected by various activities, as well as external sources.

Why monitor the implementation of standards?

 To better support our Members in a global context where cross-border issues are becoming increasingly complex, threatening the erosion of trust between trading partners, the Observatory's reports on how its international standards are put into practice.



# Monitoring the implementation of Standards pursues various purposes:

Identifying what challenges our Members face in implementing standards Supporting Members in their efforts to put standards into practice Identifying success stories around standards and promoting their implementation Ensuring that standards are fit for purpose by taking the findings back into the standard-setting process Identifying areas of improvement and proposing solutions to processes or services offered to Members that may not be fully answering their needs

# The Monitoring Report: one of the key deliverables from the Observatory

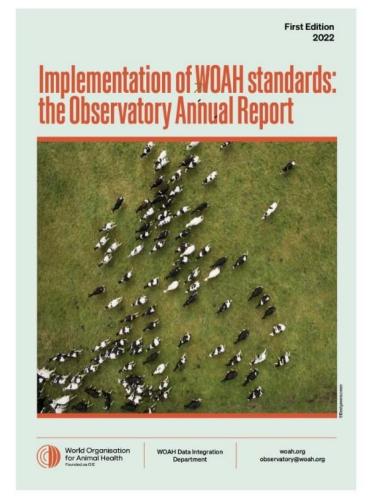
- The Monitoring Report presents a systematic overview of the implementation of a broad selection of WOAH standards at global level.

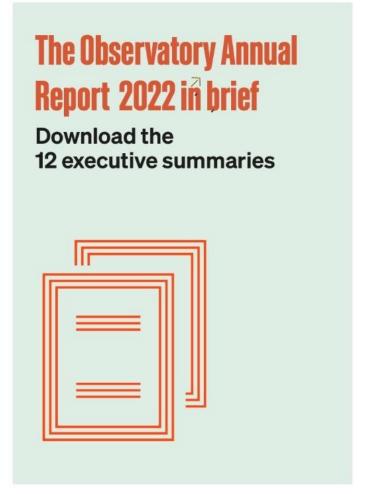

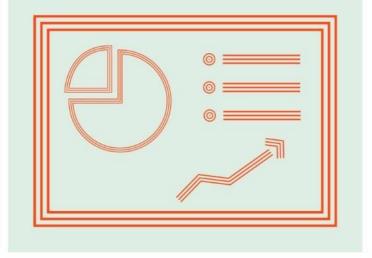

What data sources did we use to build workforce and resources indicators?

Number of veterinarians/veterinary paraprofessionals and veterinary livestock units: data extracted from the 2019 WAHIS annual reports submitted by Members Animal biomass: data extracted from the database developed by the WOAH Antimicrobial Resistance and Veterinary Products Department. The biomass of terrestrial animals (excluding bees, dogs and cats) was considered. This report used the 2019 estimation

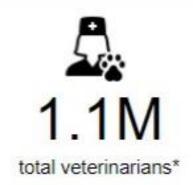

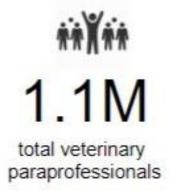

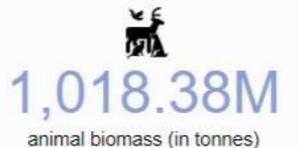

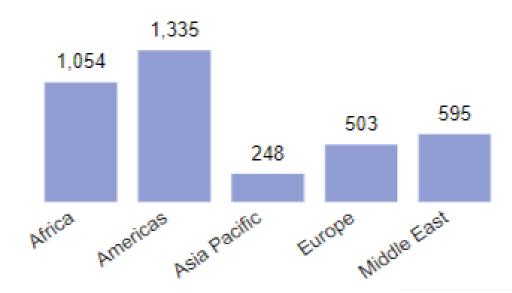
workforce: animal biomass

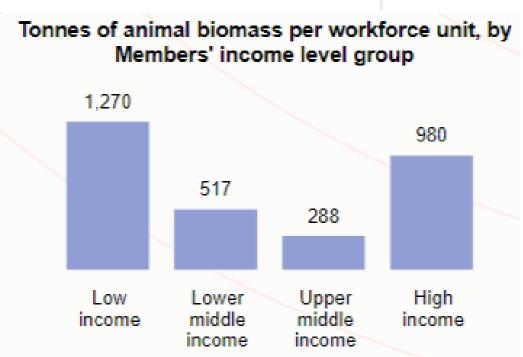




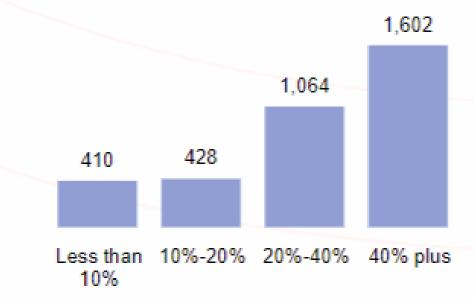
# Tonnes of animal biomass per workforce unit by WOAH region







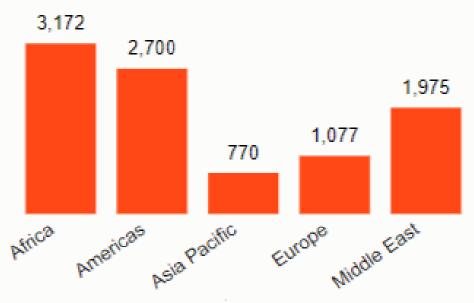









#### VLUs per workforce unit by WOAH region

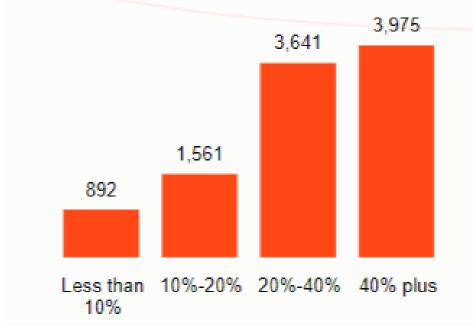

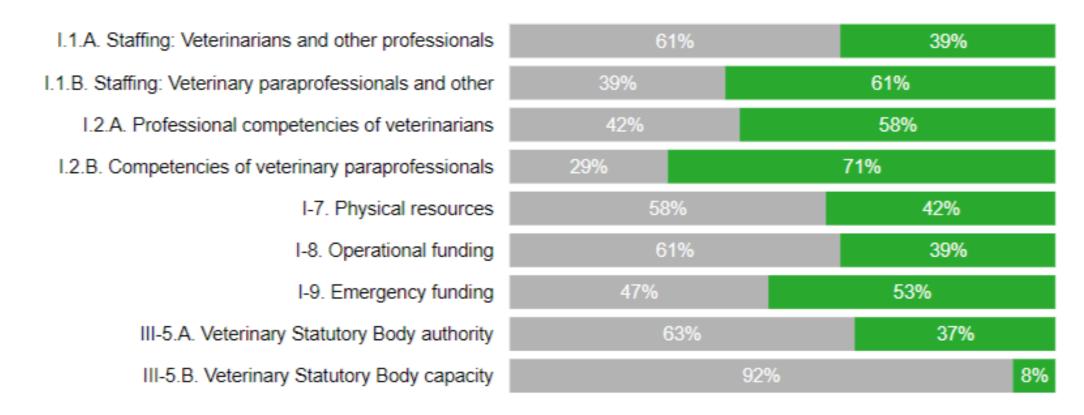






## Global Veterinary Worksforce

### Percentage of Members reaching an LoA ≥3 for each Critical Competency relevant to workforce and resources

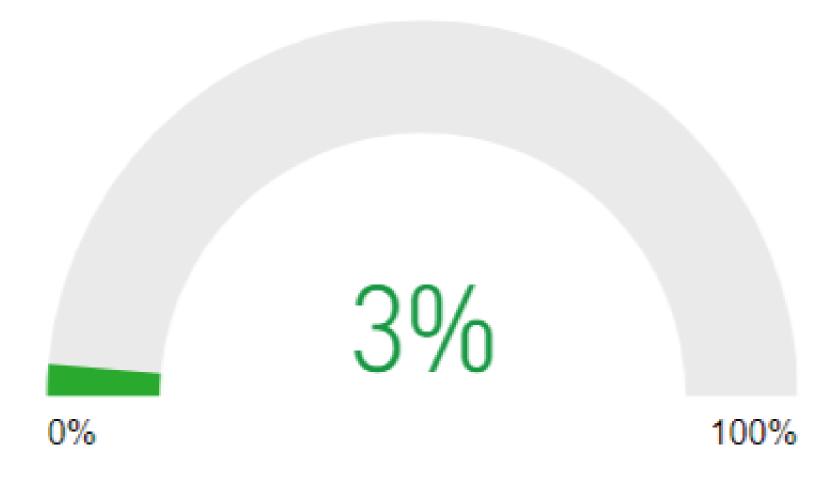


Members with an LoA ≥3 have minimal capacity or above for this Critical Competency Members with an LoA <3 have less than minimal capacity for this Critical Competency
