THE OBSERVATORY: MONITORING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF WOAH STANDARDS



Annual Report



The Observatory developing a thematic study on the implementation of standards related to transport of live animals at global level



- Assess to what extent the standards related to transport of live animals are implemented in WOAH Members;
- Seek for feedback on Members' overall experience with these standards (what factors facilitate their implementation versus what barriers prevent their implementation);
- Inform standard revision process of the Code commission.



A survey targeting the Veterinary Services of WOAH Members to assess the level of implementation of WOAH standards related to animal welfare during transport

Interviews and/or focus groups to explore the barriers to the uptake of these standards as well as the success factors with Veterinary Services of WOAH Members;

A survey targeting the private sector, with a similar aim.



Among the 183 WOAH Members contacted (NAWFPs)- 96 (52%) completed the questionnaire.

Overall, the percentage of Members transporting animals by land was much higher than transport by sea.

95 Members reported transport by land

77 Members reported transport by sea;



Having a regulatory framework covering transport by land 77 (78%) covering transport by sea (54) 70%

Animal welfare during transport as high priority reported for

- competent authority (60% of answers ranked as high priority),
- private sector (30%)
- consumers (28%).

means the killing of an animals primarily intended for human consumption.

STUNNING

means any procedure that causes loss of consciousness for the purpose of killing without avoidable distress, fear and pain

EUTHANASIA

means the killing of an animal using a method that causes a rapid and irreversible loss of consciousness with minimum pain and distress

The triennial pilot

In 2018, a 3-year pilot oject was launched by the WOAH Platform on Animal Welfare for Europe, with the collocoration of the Istituto Zooprofilattico Sperimentale dell' Abruzzo e del Molise (IZS-Terg o) aiming at building a culture of preparedness among Veterinary Services and relevant seeholders, and to support the development of Veterinary Services Contingency Plans (V5.4.5) for animal welfare during natural disasters. 10 countries participated.
