

The most common sources among dedicated funding:

11 international organizations' grants along with further sources

7 each individual ministry

Key Findings

- 1. Over 90% (38) have political support and engagement, of which 23 have political support, a coordinating body, and sustainable funding
- 2. Around 25% (9) lack a designated OH coordinating body
- 3. Only 4 receive funding through collaboration with the private sector (be it through private sector contributions or Public-Private partnerships)
- 4. Only 5 have engagement and political support at the community level



2. One Health in practice

A Sustainable and Effective Communication, Coordination, and Information-sharing Channel Between the Different Sectors Potentially Involved in OH

Results

80,5% (33) have at least a channel with any sector (13 sectors included in the questionnaire)

But of those less than half have a channel with:



- 1. Business association/Individual Business/Trade union
- 2. Civil-society organization/citizen association/other types of citizen group


Results

30 share surveillance data and reporting


8 plan surveillance and share the data and reporting among all the different sectors







Key Findings

- Of 78% members that have integrated and/or sustainably coordinated surveillance systems, 9 do not include the environmental sector
- 2. Importance of dealing with upstream drivers: in line with JPA implementation guide and more cost-effective than reacting
- 3. The H5N1 hypothetical scenario requires collaboration with the private sector



VS could have been of more assistance managing the emergency due to its inherent expertise in dealing with outbreaks, especially regarding diagnostics, epidemiology, and population control.

Level of Preparedness of VS to Respond to an Unusual Event

Epidemiological capacity and appropriate regulatory framework: at least adequate in most cases

Workforce and development of vaccines or therapeutics: inadequate in most cases







Key Findings

1. It could be useful to establish, in times of peace, a well-defined legal framework with clear expectations to be used in future emergencies and for the benefit of both the animal and human health sectors

2. Need to improve the level of preparedness regarding unusual events in the areas of vaccine and therapeutics development, and workforce






4. Tools and evaluations Key Finding






