Objective:

One portal reporting for EU Member States (MS) in ADIS for animal disease events based on WOAH and EC Legal requirements

Out of scope and continue to be reported in WAHIS:

- Notification of emerging diseases
- Six-monthly and annual reports


Approach:

- Use pilot project approach to proof the concept and implement interconnection for five MS (Spain, Latvia, Germany, Denmark, Netherlands)
- Phased approach to go-live
- > Apply the lessons learned and reduce the risk during transition with other MS

scope



2021 - 2024



Evolve ADIS to allow:

- Notification to ADIS for EU-only notifiable diseases
- Notification to WAHIS for WOAH-only Listed diseases
- Notification to ADIS and WAHIS for EU- and WOAH- notifiable diseases
 - Define Joint Management Procedure
 - Testing with pilot countries in waves to cover all scenarios
 - Evaluate against readiness criteria for go-live

Essential steps taken by pilot countries prior to interconnection:

- Close all ongoing events in WAHIS
- > Reopen in ADIS via new Immediate notification if needed
- Identify diseases reported as stable

- Perceived decrease and increase of open events and outbreaks in WAHIS during the transition to one portal reporting
- > Each affected event was annotated in epidemiological comments:

'This event is a continuation of an event previously closed to accommodate the interconnection between ADIS and WAHIS (event 5804). It has been newly created after interconnection to enable further reporting through ADIS as a single-entry point. - > Impact on WAHIS: events management, maps, weekly data extraction and dashboards
- > In relevant six-monthly reports quantitative data to be adjusted to avoid duplication

- BE READY and visit ADIS-WAHIS kiosk to flag if your country should be considered for the next batch of countries using ADIS as a single-entry point for disease notifications
