- Since 11 September 2024, ADIS and WAHIS are also linked for disease notifications – ADIS is single entry point for both ADIS and WAHIS disease notifications

Background on ADIS



How we got there?

Multi factor approach:

- political willingness:
 - Support by Member States
 - common goal between SANTE and WOAH
- Securing EU funds to make the necessary work on both ends
- Adoption of Animal Health Law made the finalisation of the project possible by further aligning the EU legislation to WOAH standards



WHY linking ADIS and WAHIS?

Important to link systems for 2 reasons:

- Reduce risks in data gaps and discrepancies → increases credibility of EU transparency in animal health
- Optimisation of resources in national Competent Authority by avoiding double data entry



ADIS Pilot Phase



Pilot MS are here

Phase 1

Continuous testing during development phase

Indicators for moving to next phase: All priority issues resolved, continuous integration build passes without major errors

Phase 2

Full internal testing phase with ADIS and WAHIS testing teams

Indicators for moving to next phase: A set of pre-defined conformance tests all pass including WAHIS business rules and scenarios without major errors

Phase 3

MSs pilot group with triple encoding of outbreaks (several waves)

Indicators for moving to next phase: Formal sign-off from pilot group and SANTE and WOAH teams ADISthat WAHIS is ready production for phase.

Phase 4

Pilot group use ADIS production as a singleentry point

Indicators for moving to next phase: when the ADIS and **WAHIS** teams agree with the pilot group that the ADIS single entry point is fit purpose (business needs of both **ADIS** and WAHIS are met)

Phase 5

All MS will be able to use ADIS as a single-entry point for disease notification




ADIS Pilot Phase

- Commitment by Pilot Member States:
 - Thank you to Denmark, Germany, Latvia, the Netherlands and Spain
- Coordination with Pilot Member States: ad hoc training, feedback sessions and 3 test waves
- Today we have Denmark, Latvia, the Netherlands and Spain who already enter both EU and WOAH notifications via ADIS!
- Germany will migrate in November 2024



ADIS Pilot Phase - 1st outbreak




- 1st outbreak entered by Latvia (11/9/24) after the migration to ADIS as single entry point was an outbreak of ASF in wild boar
- As intended, the outbreak was not sent to WAHIS (not needed as for Latvia this is reported in the WAHIS six monthly reports)
- This notification was made on AHL notification needs



ADIS Pilot Phase - 1st event

- 1st event entered into ADIS was entered by Denmark (18/9/24) after the migration
- The event report was sent to WAHIS and validated by WOAH







Next Steps



3 steps MS need to do to interconnect

- All Member States will be able to use ADIS as a single entry point for EU and WOAH notification requirements, but first they need to:
 - 1. Appoint the same users for WAHIS and ADIS notifications
 - 2. Indicate which diseases they intend to report in the six-monthly report of WAHIS so that WAHIS applies a filter for these notifications
 - 3. Liaise with WAHIS team to close ongoing events in WAHIS

Who can use ADIS as single entry point?

- All Member States
- Non-EU countries that already use ADIS, can on voluntary basis also initiate the process to use ADIS as single entry point for disease notification
- We recommend non-EU countries to also benefit from the advantages
- Some technical conditions need to be met (e.g. shape files in ADIS and WAHIS need to match)

Final Considerations



New ADIS has a learning curve

- While ADIS will assist in making the right choices when notifying, it is important to check the right boxes as this will have consequences on the information which will stay in ADIS or go to WAHIS as well
- Several users are not familiar with both EU and WOAH environments
- Each Competent Authority needs to assess how to reorganise its notification team
- Training in November in Paris will help smooth the transition
