WOAH and its Observatory



- Members are encouraged to participate in the standard-setting process and eventually adopt the standards.
- But do we know if and how Members implement standards once they are adopted?

The adoption of the **Resolution N°36** by the World Assembly of Delegates at the 2018 General Session.

The Assembly recommends that:

"The OIE develop an Observatory to monitor the implementation of its international standards, to increase transparency and to identify constraints and difficulties faced by Members"



WOAH and its Observatory: objectives and processes

Gather data and insights regarding the implementation of WOAH standards

Identify areas where the implementation of WOAH standards falls short and provide recommendations and calls for action

Disseminate information, while preserving confidentiality

Overarching goal: Improve effectiveness and use of WOAH standards

Monitoring report versus thematic studies

Monitoring report

Existing datasets are used

A wide range of standards are reviewed

A high-level assessment of the level of implementation of these standards is performed

The main deliverables are published every 5 years

Thematic studies

New, ad hoc data is collected


A small set of standards on a specific topic of interest is reviewed

The barriers and/or success factors to the implementation of these standards are assessed

Deliverables are published at least once a year

Thematic study on animal welfare

Animal welfare during transport by land and sea: level of implementation of WOAH standards and challenges faced

- Transport of live animals is a complex issue with potential high impact on animal welfare and for which societal concerns are growing
- In the context of the WOAH Global Strategy on animal welfare and the revision of the WOAH standards related to animal welfare, gaining insights on the current state of play would help informed decision-making

Thematic study on animal welfare

Animal welfare during transport by land and sea: level of implementation of WOAH standards and challenges faced

- Assess to what extent the standards related to transport of live animals are implemented in WOAH Members;
- Seek for feedback on Members' overall experience with these standards (what factors facilitate their implementation versus what barriers prevent their implementation);
- Inform standard revision process of the Code commission.

Thematic study on animal welfare

Animal welfare during transport by land and sea: level of implementation of WOAH standards and challenges faced

• Phase 1: A survey targeting the Veterinary Services of WOAH Members to assess the level of implementation of WOAH standards related to animal welfare during transport

- Phase 2: Interviews and/or focus groups to explore the barriers to the uptake of these standards as well as the success factors with Veterinary Services of WOAH Members;
- Transport by land and sea only;
- Species covered by Chapters 7.2. and 7.3, i.e. cattle, small ruminants, pigs, poultry, buffaloes, camelids;
- Global scale;
- Time frame: current situation.



Phase 1- Approach for data collection

Animal welfare during transport by land and sea: level of implementation of WOAH standards and challenges faced

- Survey open from 15 November to 31 December 2023
- 1 online questionnaire in 3 languages
- Target respondents: National Welfare Focal Points (NAWFP) of all WOAH Members


Response rates: 96 Members (52%) completed the questionnaire


Level of prioritisation depends on the stakeholders

Q43: To what extent is animal welfare during transport by land and sea a priority topic in your country?






Presence of regulatory framework – by Regions and by Species












Main requirements of the Terrestrial Code are not always included in regulatory frameworks












Mechanism to enforce the regulatory framework by Veterinary services



- Explore the barriers to the uptake of animal welfare standards during transport as well as the success factors with Veterinary Services of WOAH Members; focus on specific articles of the Chapters 7.2. and 7.3
- Conduct of the focus groups / interviews with different profiles of members in 2025
- > 72% of respondents agreed to share their experience on that topic on a one-to-one interview or a focus group
