# Long distance transport: future challenges for the industry



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## WHAT IS UECBV?

#### **UECBV** is the **European Livestock and Meat Trades Union**. It represents the national

federations of the:

- livestock traders
- livestock markets
- meat industry: slaughterhouses, cutting and preparation plants
- wholesale meat traders
- international meat traders

#### UECBV focuses on live cattle, pigs, sheep, goats and horses and its meat



#### Today, UECBV represents 50 associations out of :

- **24 EU Member States** as well as certain EFTA countries.
- Other countries, EU trade partners in the meat sector, are also associated to the UECBV (Japan and Ukraine)


#### **3 European Associations**

Why long-distance transport is needed? Long distance transport: more than 8 hours

## Intra EU

- Journey time includes loading and unloading from 8h transport →
  5 hours effective journey → 300km can be "LDT"
- LDT can be performed within a member state
- Specialised regions clustered regions




Why long-distance transport is needed? Long distance transport: more than 8 hours

## **Exports to third countries**

- Demand of live animals instead of meat:
  - Problems in cold chain for meat
  - Different se of carcasses and cuts
  - Easier market access for live animals
  - Import duties
- A ban on export is not compensated by meat demand.




Bluetongue situation in the EU





#### Animal Health – Bluetongue-1-3-4-8 – Spain

New disease or serotype, no vaccine, no trade

- BTV3, BTV12, EHD (emerging diseases) → more regions under restrictions
- However, disease are spreading
- Vaccination strategy  $\rightarrow$  effectiveness! e.g. BTV 8,
- But lack of effective and safe vaccines / long time for development


## Spain $\rightarrow$ Shortage and impact on prices

- **Decline in Livestock Entries**: Live cattle imports to Spain, especially from France, have dropped by 18% in the last months due to bluetongue-related restrictions. This has disrupted Spain's reliance on imported cattle for fattening.
- **Record High Prices**: Supply shortages have driven the cost of replacement animals to historic levels, further exacerbated by limited imports from France and Ireland.
- **Feedlot Efficiency Challenges**: Spanish feedlots face operational inefficiencies due to staggered animal entries, health risks, and elevated costs, despite steady demand supported by robust meat prices.
- **Meat Industry Pressures**: High live animal prices are straining meat industry margins, as the increased costs are difficult to pass along the supply chain, creating profitability challenges.

# **EC proposal: protection on animals during transport** Main goals

- Limitation in journey times no LDT for slaughter (loading unloading time included)
- Increase of space allowance
- Extreme temperatures
- Minimum age for unweaned animals
- Veterinarians at loading and unloading
- Export: stricter measures



## **EC proposal: protection on animals during transport** UECBV position

- Limitation in journey times no LDT for slaughter (loading unloading time included)
  - Animal demands in other EU regions
  - Farms in remote areas and small farms are left behind 9h is not enough
  - Loading and unloading  $\rightarrow$  stressful situation / need for a smooth handling
- Increase in space allowances
- Extreme temperatures
- Minimum age for unweaned animals
- Veterinarians at loading and unloading



## **EC proposal: protection on animals during transport** UECBV position

- Limitation in journey times no LTS for slaughter (loading unloading time included)
- Increase of space allowance:
  - Increase of cost for transport (X2)
  - More risk of accidents when truck turns/breaks
- Extreme temperatures
- Minimum age for unweaned animals
- Veterinarians at loading and unloading



## **EC proposal: protection on animals during transport** UECBV position

- Limitation in journey times no LDS for slaughter (loading unloading time included)
- Increase of space allowance
- Extreme temperatures
  - Differences between species / categories
  - Technical advances are not stimulated
  - National wether forecasts can be different between MS / inconsistency
  - Differences between geographical EU regions
- Minimum age for unweaned animals
- Veterinarians at loading and unloading



## **EC proposal: protection on animals during transport** UECBV position

- Limitation in journey times no LDS for slaughter (loading unloading time included)
- Increase of space allowance
- Extreme temperatures
- Minimum age for unweaned animals
  - From 14 to 35 days
  - Behaiviour difficult to handle
  - Increase of costs
  - Dairy farms under pressure
- Veterinarians at loading and unloading



## **EC proposal: protection on animals during transport** UECBV position

- Limitation in journey times no LDS for slaughter (loading unloading time included)
- Increase of space allowance
- Extreme temperatures
- Minimum age for unweaned animals
- Veterinarians at loading and unloading (at every loading/unloading operation)
  - Resposibility of farmers
  - High cost
  - Lack of veterinarians



#### Conclusions

- LDT does not always mean transport between countries
- LDT may also be within country
- Long-distance transports of livestock are needed for a dynamic livestock activity within the EU and keeping rural activity small producers
- Limitations on LDT can bring to trade disruptions such as increase of prices in areas with animal demand
- Temperature limits should take into account differences between kinds of animals and geographic situation.
- More knowledge is still needed for redefining the requirements for transporting animals without jeopardising the internal market.
