

Why EU action?

Internal market compromised	 72 million dogs and 83 million cats in EU Trade accounts for EUR 1,3 Bn No EU welfare rules & different national rules = Uneven playing field for operators
Illegal trade	 Legitimate operators under pressure from illegal traders Consumers not protected from fraud
Suboptimal animal welfare	 Lack of welfare rules at EU level Limitations in traceability of dogs and cats
Citizens' expectations	 Eurobarometer 2023 - 74% of citizens want better protection of companion animals

Cat related notifications in i-RASFF

• 1 out of 10 notifications involve cats

Commercial movements disguised as noncommercial

• Fraudulent practice to be tackled



1 – Who? establishments keeping/breeding

Breeders, Pet shops, Shelters

• Main operators that place on the market

Threshold to exempt small operators

• Different for each type of operator

Requirements based on welfare principles

• Tailored to each type of operator



1 - establishments - general requirements

Caretakers

- Sufficient number
- Competent

Animal welfare visits

- Annual visit and advice from a vet
- Recording of findings and follow-up

Provide information to acquirers

- on welfare
- on responsible ownership



1 - establishments - specific requirements

Feeding and watering

- Frequency
- Colostrum
- Weaning age

Housing

- No keeping in containers (limited derogations)
- Temperatures, lighting, space allowances

Health

- Daily inspections
- Prevention of common diseases
- Onset of reproduction, frequency of pregnancies
- Older animals, retirement



1 - establishments - specific requirements

Behaviour

- No restraining (few exceptions), no tethering
- Socialisation
- Enrichment

Painful practices

- No mutilations (exception for medical reasons)
- Neutering by a vet under anaesthesia and analgesia
- No painful handling practices



1 – breeding establishments

Breeding strategies

- Non harmful
- Prohibition of inbreeding

Approval by competent authorities

- Once, before onset of activities
- On-site inspection
- Certificate of approval



2 - traceability

Obligation for

- Any transfer of ownership of dog or cat in the EU market
- Includes imports

Identification of dogs and cats

• Implantation of a microchip by a vet or assistant

Registration of microchips

- In national databases
- Databases will communicate (interoperable)



2 - traceability

Suppliers must provide to acquirers

- proof of identification and registration
- basic information (origin, species, breed, sex)

Acquirers' power to verify

- Via an EU online system checking the identification and registration
- Online advertisements will signal the possibility of verification



3 - dogs and cats entering the EU

Third countries must

- meet EU or equivalent requirements
- be listed by Commission

Establishments must

- meet EU or equivalent requirements
- be listed by 3rd countries' competent authorities

Animals must be

- accompanied by attestation of compliance (official certificate)
- registered in a national database within 48 hours



Council adopts negotiating mandate

Proposes a series of draft amendments to the Commission proposal, some of which introduce additional draft measures such as:

- Ban of hybrids
- Limit the number of births for breeding after C section is performed
- Extreme traits excluded from breeding
- No shows and competitions for animals with extreme conformational traits

Co-legislators


EU legislation

European Parliament, Council

Examine the proposal Propose amendments Agree on the final legislation
