Monitoring and evaluation – SVA/RVAs of the Czech Rep.



- 14 RVA
- 1 BIP airport of Václav Havel
- 20x assembly centers
- 7 control post



Monitoring and evaluation – SVA/RVAs of the Czech Rep.

- At central level the national control plan, communication of NCs
- At regional/local level (RVAs) documentary checks, on the spot checks
- Person responsible for welfare checks:
 - Direct export from a farm or from an assembly center official veterinarian (employee of RVA) – department of epidemiology
 - Movement from a farm to an AC welfare check can be done by practicioner and then epidemiology guarantees are certificated by the official veterinarian
- Control of transporters at least 10times per year or 10% from all of the dispatched consignments



Trade routes - bovine

- Change because of BTV 3 in 2024
- Mostly exporting country
 - Turkey
 - Kazachstan
 - Uzbekistan
 - RF
 - North Africa
- Within EU
 - Belgium calves
 - Italy mostly calves, others categories
 - Spain calves




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Overview of country livestock transport and trade – 2021-2024

National animal welfare standards

- Welfare checks prior departure of animals official veterinarian (employe of RVA)
- Control are performed during 24h before loading
- 3rd countries control during the loading on a vehicle, reinforced controls
- Mostly from the assembly centers under veterinary control
- Welfare check is part of certification together with completing TRACES and other export documentation



Monitoring and evaluation

- Approval of assembly centers and transporters the standards for the competences of animal handlers— according to the EU legislation (no specific national standards)
- Retrospective checks of/feedbacks to the consignments:

Feedback from the border control (TRACES)

Feedback from the places of destination

Feedback from the returned journey logs, GPS information and temperature records

Conclusions - challenges

 CZ is in compliance with WOAH standards regarding animal welfare during long distance by land – most of the standards are set in the provisions of national/EU legislation

gaps/weaknesses and challenges:

- communication with the 3rd countries (mostly none) feedbacks
- language barrier
- sanctions slow and complex process, ineffective
- cross-border transport information about facilities/working hours
- emergency situations contingency plans



Conclusions - possible actions

- WOAH standards regarding animal welfare during long distance transport

 dissemination of the standards incorporation into trainings of
 handlers/operators
- strenghten the communication with the 3rd countries online platform for sharing the info - information about facilities/working hours
- collaboration on network documents
- format for the feedbacks/language versions
- collaboration on contingency plans
- regular (online) meetings



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
