
The network of WOAH National Contact Points on long-distance transportation in Europe



How could WOAH support FP in their daily work?

- Create a network of contact points on two other priority topics (dog population management and natural disaster management)
- Support in building a multi-annual AW Action Plan
- Facilitate the sharing and exchange of their experiences



Main conclusions

- Importance of networking to improve collaboration in the region
- Sharing best practices and concrete work examples is essential for learning from each other by exchanging ideas and building common knowledge.
- WOAH support is needed to facilitate and promote networking and sharing of experiences. (e.g., regional contact points for priority topics other than transport, sub-regional networks, e-depository and flash meetings on best practices or concrete work examples).
- An update on the WOAH activities at the global and regional level is important for the Focal Points to help them in their tasks, to identify what is of interest to them and what would be interesting for them that WOAH develops
- Training and updates on transversal and technical animal welfare topics to help acquire new knowledge and develop existing



WOAH Platform Action Plans' bridging workshop on Disaster Management and Risk Reduction

Conclusions:

- Strengthen communication and collaboration between Competent Authorities and stakeholders.
- To develop specific protocols/procedures and harmonized templates related to technical and administrative aspects of DMRR, including process of verification, updates, and revisions.
- To organize additional networking and training events, in presence or online (I.e., risk analysis, data collection and the use of AI);
- To promote the development of digital information management applications to be used for training, to analyze the consequences of a disaster, and for tactical deployment of operational resources.
- To understand how Public-Private Partnership (PPP) could contribute to the management of veterinary emergencies.
- To value the role of NGOs and their complementarity to achieve shared objectives and goals of DMRR.

Conclusions:

- The countries' presentations recalled the importance of being prepared and adaptable to navigate uncertainty and manage conflicting priorities and unexpected situations
- It was highlighted that Platform can also offer the possibility of collecting relevant data and evidence for advocacy purposes.
- Importance of leveraging "Collective power", the increasing availability of various tools (e.g. training modules) to match the Member's needs.
