

What does FAO REU do on PPR?

- Assisting countries to obtain official disease freedom status for PPR
- Assisting countries to prepare or control PPR (or in the past LSD)

Assisting countries to achieve official disease freedom status for PPR

Azerbaijan

<u>FAO assisted Azerbaijan to obtain official PPR disease free status</u>. First former Soviet Union, but non-EU country (with the exception of Russian Federation) to achieve this status.

Armenia

<u>Strengthening capacities for prevention of the Peste des</u>
<u>Petits Ruminants (PPR) disease and recognition of PPR free</u>
<u>status</u> - through serosurveillance (2025 – 2027)

Uzbekistan

Supporting preparation of dossier through serosurveillance

Georgia

Following PPR outbreak of March 2024 FAO initiated a Technical Cooperation Programme (TCP) on Emergency assistance for the control of Peste des petits ruminants (PPR) in Georgia (2024-2025)

Kazakhstan


<u>Strengthening capacities for the prevention and detection of Peste</u> <u>des Petits Ruminants (PPR)</u> - assisting the country in ceasing vaccination and applying for stage 4 of the PPR Monitoring and Assessment Tool (PMAT).

Albania

Supported with 30 penetrative captive bolts, 150 boxes of cartridges and 100 PPEs suits in 2025.

North Macedonia


Exercise "Pramenka" held 25 – 27 March 2025




Virtual Learning



FAO REU's Virtual Learning Centers supports the region since 2021 with trainings on Animal Health offering tutored and self-directed courses.

Self-directed courses
