


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
The WOAH Capacity Building Framework



The PVS Pathway is a Monitoring & Evaluation Framework AND a capacity building programme, and therefore can support informed action & accountability








Pandemic Fund Results Framework






Annual Report work?



PVS Self-Assessment Annual Report:

- measures systematically any actions taken by Members following PVS Recommendations
- reminds Members to act over time
- incites advocacy for resource mobilisation





Members report on each recommendation and answer simple questions

- Bespoke questionnaire made of the recommendations made in their latest PVS Evaluation Report
- Only the most recent data is used (latest Evaluation recommendations)
- Required prior to all future PVS Follow-up Evaluations
- Each year, only recs not fully implemented will be included in PVS SAAR



Total Recommendations



- 69% of recommendations required additional resources
- 59% of recommendations obtained additional resources
- But only 52% of recommendations obtained sufficient resources
- National authorities most frequently provided additional resources, followed by External Partners
