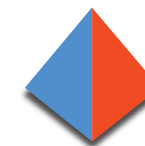

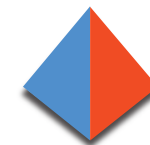

## Recommendations of PPR Roadmap meeting in Dushanbe

### 1. Strengthen Surveillance and Early Detection:

- *Improve active and passive surveillance systems for rapid detection of outbreaks.*
- *Expand sero-monitoring and epidemiological investigations to confirm absence of virus circulation.*
- *Strengthen laboratory diagnostics and collaboration with reference laboratories.*

### 2. Optimize Vaccination Strategies:

- *Achieve and maintain  $\geq 70\%$  vaccination coverage in targeted populations.*
- *Implement risk-based vaccination in high-risk areas and buffer zones.*
- *Conduct post-vaccination monitoring (PVM) to evaluate immunity and adjust vaccination campaigns.*

### 3. Apply an Ecosystem-Based Approach:

- *Conduct epidemiological studies to identify transmission ecosystems.*
- *Adapt surveillance and vaccination strategies based on epidemiological links rather than geographic boundaries.*

## Recommendations of PPR Roadmap meeting in Dushanbe

### 4. Strengthen Regional Coordination:

- *Harmonize vaccination, surveillance, and movement control policies among neighbouring countries.*
- *Improve cross-border collaboration and information sharing on outbreaks and animal movements.*
- *Develop a regional PPR strategy with coordinated actions.*

### 5. Progress Along the Eradication Pathway:

- *Implement PMAT and strengthen national PPR control programmes.*
- *Prepare dossiers for WOAHA recognition of PPR-free status where applicable.*
- *Improve contingency planning, outbreak investigation, and virus tracing.*

### 6. Strengthen Implementation and Stakeholder Engagement:

- *Engage private veterinarians and livestock stakeholders in vaccination programmes.*
- *Ensure availability of quality-assured PPR vaccines.*
- *Improve farmer awareness, training, and communication to enhance reporting and compliance*

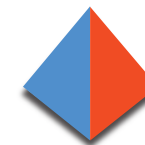
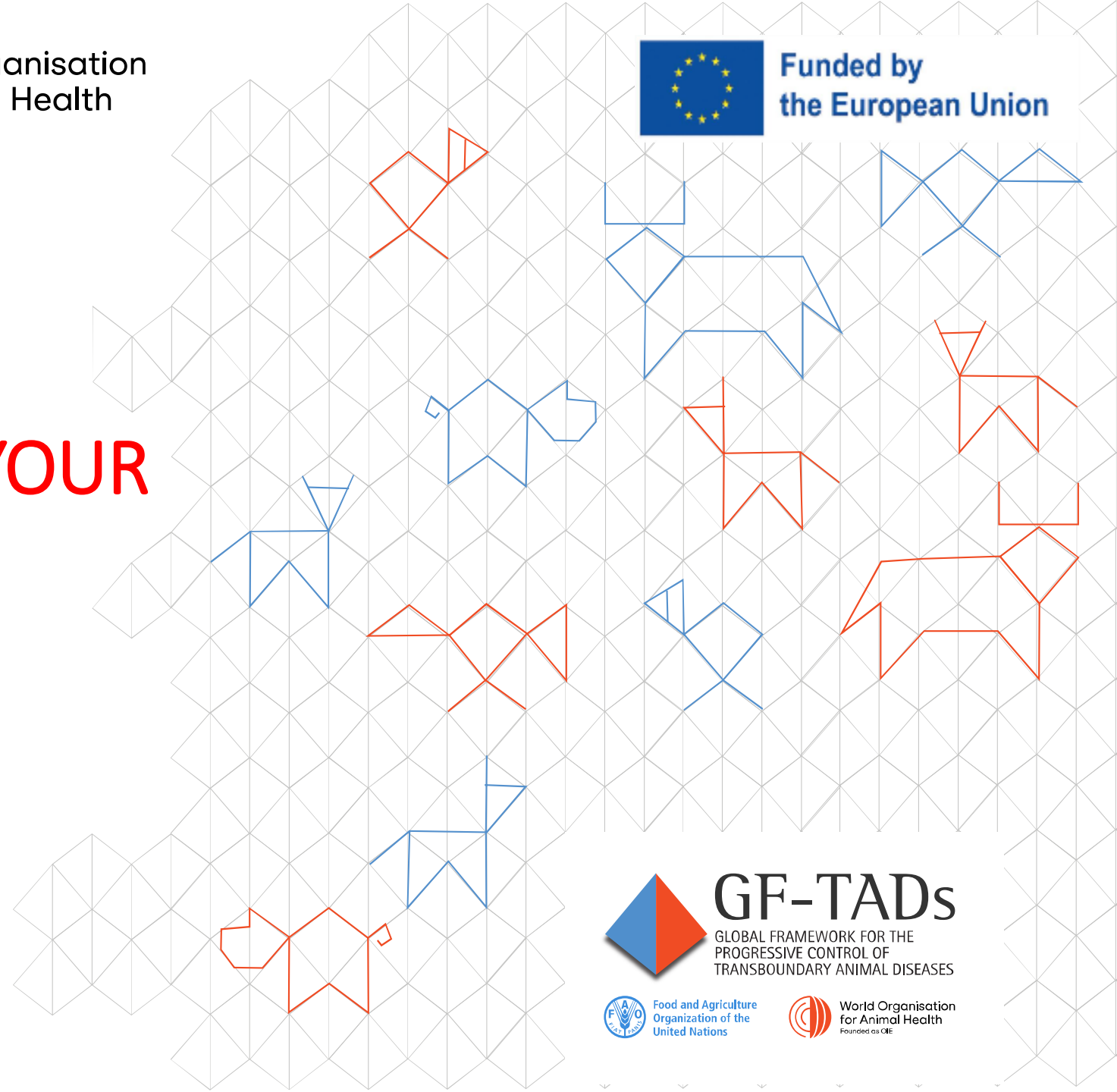
