


















- 2014 Astana meeting
- 13 countries present (Turkmenistan did not attend) + Russia as observer
- 2015 Almaty meeting
- 13 countries present (Iraq did not attend) + Russia as observer
- Full 'GF-TADs Acceptance process' conducted
 - Self assessment questionnaires
 - Analysis by WG (questionnaires and CPs when relevant)
 - Plenary presentation
 - Individual Interviews
 - Decision by RAG members
- New RAG elected (Turkey / Georgia / New RAG elected (Turkey / Azerbaijan / Kazakhstan)
 - → Financial and technical support received from EuFMD





2014 Astana meeting - outcomes

Four countries remain in Stage 1 (no progression →): Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, Afghanistan;

These countries remain in Stage 1 as no progress have been evidenced

Six countries move to provisional Stage 2 (progression ↗): Georgia, Iraq, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Syria,

These countries have demonstrated some evidence to progress to Stage 2; however, their risk-based strategic plan is not robust enough and it must be refined within 6 months; otherwise they will be downgraded to Stage 1.

These countries have not provided a robust risk-based

Two countries in Stage 2 move to provisional Stage 2 (Status quo →): Armenia, Azerbaijan

strategic plan and are required to provide it within 6 months, otherwise they will be downgraded to Stage 1.

Two countries remains in Stage 2 (Status quo →): Turkey (Anatolia), Iran

These countries are continuing progression within Stage 2.

2015 Almaty meeting - outcomes

	Four countries remain in Stage 1 (no progression →): Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, Afghanistan;	These countries cannot endlessly remain in Stage 1, since in the absence of control measures and unknown epidemiological situation, they can potentially jeopardize efforts deployed by neighbouring countries.
*	Three countries remain in provisional Stage 2 (no progression →): Armenia, Azerbaijan, Kyrgyzstan;	These countries have to provide evidence of a robust risk-based strategic plan by October 2015 to move to Stage 2; otherwise they will be downgraded to Stage 1.
	Three countries moved to Stage 2 (progression ↗): Georgia, Iran, Pakistan;	These countries have provided excellent risk-based strategic plan.
	One country remains in Stage 2 (Status quo →): Turkey (Anatolia);	Turkey (Anatolia) is continuing progression within Stage 2.
	Syria was not assessed	They will be assessed by another relevant RAG
	Kazakhstan was not assessed	Kaz declined to be assessed as they were preparing to submit their dossier to OIE for a FMD free zone.

Recommendations of the meeting



Recommendations of the 8th Regional meeting to review progress West Eurasia FMD Control Roadmap 2026 Aimsty, Kassificatina, 25-20 April, 2015

Considering

- The adoption of the FAC-OIS Global Strategy for the control of FIND (Bangkok, June 2012) with its 3 lear-related Components respectively on the control of FIND, the reinforcement of Veserinary Services and the combined control of FIND with other animal cleasures;
- The importance of controlling FIIID at regional level and the vessels of previous FIIID regional Roadman meetings which took place since 2008 (Shinaz 2008; Isranbul2010; Isranbul3010; Isranbul3010; Isranbul3010; Isranbul3010;
- The commitment of the countries from Western Suyleds to the Progressive Control Pathway for Footand Mouth Disease (PCP-FILD) and Roadmap process;
- The added value to organize the peer nation of the PCP stage assessment and of the control
 programmes which includes the presentation of the results of such assessment during the regional
 roadings presentation;
- The importance of having a Regional Edvisory Group (REG) for West Fundals composed of three CVCs and leaders of the Spi and leaders of regional networks to analyse and present the results of the assessment to the profilegating countries;
- That many countries of the region are in Sage 1 or 2 of the PCP-FIID and that for moving into Sage 2, countries are regional or presents comprehensive risk-based careagle plan;
 That progression along the PCP-FIID regions a comprehensive understanding of FIID, including
- apidemiology, "designed and socio-economic segects, and the practical application of his knowledge to develop a control strategy;"
- Othough FMD situation seems to be similar in the regionisub-regions, the control programmes are offerent, and this justifies a need for considering national control strategies in the consectoring local and global aggregations;
- The need to strengthen Governments' capacity to prepare their national control programmes and project proposals to be presented to the national decision makers and donors, in line with OIS standards on FILE;
- That effective Visionizary Services are indepensable for the correct of FIID correct arranging and that the PCP recognization includes reference to the relevant professional or disease (PVB) orbital (critical comparanciaty related to the prevention and correct of diseases;
 That sociotecomonic Impera reseasement or FIID in Interestic production, inclineds, and tool security.
- That acclesconding impact seasonment of FIIID in Investock production, livelihoods and tood security, and coattlement analysis of FIIID control options have to be undertaken and used when preparing national control representation and financial product proposals:
- That countries have requested support to improve their capacity particularly in epidemiology and risk assessment;
- Three FIRDV serogges (C, A and date) continue to circulate in the region and the region is exposed to
 threat then visit from good 1 (SECFIED) and less so from SECRC (Sendale-15 years back), and lift
 (Died-2001 currently circulating)
