

# 87<sup>th</sup> General Session, Technical item 2 Resolution N.33

A **global initiative for the control of ASF** be launched using the <u>GF-TADs</u> mechanism to develop, <u>improve and harmonise</u> national, regional and global partnership and coordination [...] <u>minimise adverse impacts</u> on animal health and welfare, international trade, and social wellbeing.

# Theory of Change

- Schematic representation of chain of events required to achieve the goal
- Consists of problem statement, and links the objectives, outputs and outcomes to achieve the overall goal

# Logic framework


- Heart of initiative
- Defines the problem, objectives, outputs, outcomes and the overall goal
- Indicators for evaluation and monitoring of progress


