

Global situation of ASF




OIE WAHIS disease outbreak map, annually (2005-2020)

Global control of ASF, GF-TADs initiative

- Developed by FAO and OIE
- Provide a platform to harmonise and coordinate national and regional efforts
- Create a framework to ensure synergies and good coordination
- Consider the realities of the regions directly or indirectly impacted by ASF
- A 6-year (2020–2025) strategic plan linked to a 2-year operational plan
- Define the objectives and provide structure for specific outputs and outcomes to achieve global control
- Monitoring of indicators at output level by FAO and OIE

The elements of the Initiative

)ie

Narrative	 Defines the call for action, strategic challenges, governance, M&E and the theory of change
Theory of Change	 Schematic representation of chain of events required to achieve the goal Consists of problem statement, and links the objectives, outputs and outcomes to achieve goal
Logic framework	 Heart of initiative Defines the problem, objectives, outputs, outcomes and the overall goal Indicators for evaluation and monitoring of progress
Operational plan	 Specific activities implemented under GF-TADS responding to the objectives

ASF is a global threat to food security with negative socio-economic impact. Although control is feasible, success requires regional and global coordination.


