

6 Outputs/31 actions

✓ Output 1: Develop and implement surveillance of AMR

- Expand the existing AMR surveillance in bacteriological laboratories
- Raise awareness among veterinarians and farmers of passive surveillance

✓ Output 2: Provide laboratory training

- Establishing an integrated surveillance of ESBL producing E. coli
- Provide training on AMR testing for central and regional veterinary labs

✓ Output 3: Monitor AMU/AMC

Launch of OIE data collection on antimicrobials intended for use in animals

- International classifications of antimicrobials in human and animal
- Complete the tripartite legal assessment
- Identify priorities for legal reform in the country

✓ Output 5: Develop and implement standards for biosecurity

- Implementation of biosecurity, good management in animal husbandry
- Strengthen Tajik capacity to control OIE-listed diseases

✓ Output 6: Information campaigns, workshops and training courses

- Awareness campaigns targeting different audiences on prudent AB use
- Broadcasting on AMR/AMU through TV and radio program
- · Promote behaviour change on good hand hygiene in community
- Training modules and workshops for education on AMR
