

Terms of reference OHCM











- One Health Executive Group: Ensures political engagement, provides leadership and governance, defines the strategic direction for One Health in support of global and regional governance structures.
- One Health Technical Group: Keeps oversight, facilitates and coordinates technical support to Member States, engage in agenda setting and resource mobilization, provides Secretariat function.
- Partner platform: Convene partners, share information, plans and expertise, combine resources to avoid duplication and seek synergies for One Health support to countries in order to maximize impact and leave no country behind.

- 2. Improved multisectoral coordination to address zoonotic diseases
- 3. Strengthened awareness and understanding
- 4. Improved coordination among the Quadripartite and partners











JOINT STATEMENT OF INTENT TO COORDINATE ONE-HEALTH PRIORITIES IN EUROPE AND CENTRAL ASIA

The Quadripartite in Europe and Central Asia – the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the World Health Organization (WHO)¹, and the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH) and – are committed to strengthen multi-sectoral coordination and multi-lateral efforts to combat health threats associated with interactions between humans, animals, and the environment





1. Reduced Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR)




Specific technical areas of focus for One Health



- Antimicrobial resistance
 - National action planning, AMU/AMC, surveillance, infection prevention and control, training, awareness raising
- Zoonotic diseases
 - Multisectoral coordination to address zoonotic diseases, response preparedness to zoonotic diseases, national bridging workshops
- Food safety
 - Strengthen national food safety systems, food chain approach, foodborne disease outbreak investigation and response
- Health emergencies preparedness and response
 - National action planning for health security, laboratory strengthening, surveillance and risk assessment, IHR (2005) core capacity strengthening
- Neglected tropical diseases
 - · Parasitic and vectorborne diseases, surveillance and control
- Environment and health
 - Climate change, WASH, pollution, land use changes and natural disasters
